
School? Send an email to Miss Wilkinson in the first instance. Tell us what you can offer the school and the time you are willing to commit.

magnificent hamper and give a selection of new toys to those in need. Thank you!







COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

This morning, Year 2 led our whole school assembly telling us all about Advent. They told us all about the symbols that are used and how we can get ready for Christmas. Father Nicholas very kindly blessed our Advent Wreaths which were lovingly made by Miss Walker - thank you!

We finished thinking about our virtue of hope by having a meditation on the theme and our Key Stage Two children led a worship with this theme for other schools in the Trust. Next week, our new virtue will be patience.

On Tuesday, the children thought about the statement: Simple things can make us happy. The children reflected on what we mean by simple things and suggested which simple things make them happy. Some of their ideas were: hugs, playing with friends, seeing different colours and their pets. We listened to a reading from the book of Ecclesiastes which says, "There is always something you can find to be happy about."

TRAVELLING CRIBS

During Advent, the children will be bringing home travelling cribs to share with their families. Please take time to share these with your children and reflect on the Christmas story - thank you!

CLASS PAGES

YEAR R NEWS

It has been another very busy week in Reception. Our nativity rehearsals are now in full swing, and the children are doing a super job at learning their lines and songs. Please keep practising at home. They are very excited for their performance in 3 weeks!

In Drawing Club, we have been reading the story of 'The Christmas Pine' by Julia Donaldson. We drew super pictures of the Christmas tree, the forest and even thought a way to transport the tree from Norway. The children are making great progress with their writing and wrote some super words and sentences.

In Maths, we have continued our learning about the numbers 4 and 5. We have looked at more than and less than and the composition of each number. We introduced the concept of the part- whole model. We encouraged the children to say what they could see e.g. 2 is a part, 2 is a part and 4 is the whole number.

In RE, we learnt about the importance of Advent. We enjoyed looking at the Advent wreath and learnt about what each candle represents. We then wrote an Advent promise.

YEAR 1 NEWS

In English, we have started looking at our new book which is called "Coming Home" by Michael Morpurgo. The children have made predictions about what the book will be about by looking at the front cover and the key words from the blurb. The children then used adjectives to describe the appearance of the main character which is a robin.

There has been a robin theme in Year 1 this week as we have also made our Christmas decorations for the school Christmas tree which are robins.

In Maths, the children have applied their addition skills to different word problems. We have also started to look at subtraction - linking it to part whole models.

Following on from our walk around Otley last Tuesday, in our topic work, we looked at pictures of different types of house in Otley and talked about the features of a house that we can see from the outside.

In RE, we have started to think about Advent. The children were excited to talk about their Advent Calendars and we learnt that we can get ready for Christmas by making Advent promises to help other people. The grown ups at home will be pleased to know that lots of the children have promised to keep their bedrooms tidy and to help do jobs around the home! On Thursday, the children learned about the symbols of the Advent wreath and made their own replica.

YEAR 2 NEWS

As part of our RE work, we have been learning about the meaning of the Advent wreath. we learnt about the meaning of each candle and why we use evergreen leaves in a circular shape. We then thought very carefully about the Advent promises we would like to make.

In Maths, we have continued to develop our addition skills. We have been working hard and have learnt how to make an exchange when we are adding two 2-digit numbers. We are getting good at using the base ten to support us with this and drawing our workings on a place value frame.

In English, we have been retelling the story 'Winter's Child'. We created a story map to help us remember the key points, then used our amazing vocabulary to help us make our retelling interesting for the reader. Everybody worked extremely hard, and Mrs Holmes is very impressed with everybody's work!

In Geography, we have been learning about physical and human features. We looked at some photos of Otley to find these features locally. We then learnt about the physical features that we would find in the Arctic Circle. We found out about glaciers, icebergs, mountains and rivers.

YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, Year 3 analysed features of an information text. We then developed simple facts about rats into multi-clause sentences with conjunctions and fronted adverbials, and used these to write their own reports about rats.

In RE, we began to learn about the symbols of Advent. We wrote Advent promises before creating our own paper Advent wreaths and learning about the different meanings.

In Maths, the children continued to practise the formal column method for addition and subtraction. They used different concrete resources to show how ones and tens are exchanged and solved word problems using the formal method.

In Geography, we used maps of Otley to find physical and human features. We discussed how areas can be more urban or rural, and compared the Yorkshire Dales National Park to the centre of Otley.

In DT, we designed and created a story book with moving parts! We used different methods of creating mechanisms with paper to make our story books more exciting.

YEAR 4 NEWS

We've had wonderfully festive week in Year 4! On Monday, we spent the day Christmas crafting by making some beautiful Christmas stocking decorations. The children started the day practising a variety of different stitches and decorating techniques before cutting out the template for their decorations and adding their designs. By the end of the day, everyone had completed some fantastic decorations!

In Maths, the children continued their work on multiplication, exploring links between the 3, 6 and 9 times-tables to deepen their understanding and embed fluency with these times-tables. Later in the week, the children used their knowledge of multiples and count in 7s to make the link between repeated addition and multiplication.

In English, we continued reading our class novel 'The Iron Man'. Looking more closely at the novel, the children discussed the author's use of language and made predictions as to what might happen next in the book.

In RE, we have been reflecting on the special job God asked of Mary. We wrote fact files about Mary and linked her story to that of her cousin Elizabeth.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths, we have started our new topic of fractions. We recapped what a unit fraction and a non-unit fraction were, as well as what the numerator and denominator mean within a fraction. We then looked at how you can find an equivalent fraction to unit and non-unit fractions. We used our times-tables knowledge and recognised that you find an equivalent fraction by multiplying your numerator and denominator by the same number.

In DT, the children were constructing different beams that had different cross sections. We discussed the importance of beams when constructing a bridge and how differently shaped beams can be stronger than others. The children are excited to be testing their beams next week and seeing which ones are the strongest.

As part of our Christmas crafting, the children have been incredibly busy creating their Christmas baubles. We have used many different skills when cross-stitching our Christmas puddings such as intricacy, patience and perseverance. The children have amazed me with how fantastic their sewing skills are and we can't wait for everyone to see them when they are on the tree.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In English, we started reading Anne Frank's diary. We learned that her favourite present was her diary which she named Kitty. As we were reading the diary, we discussed how Anne was feeling and added it to the axis of emotions grid.

In Maths, we used paper strips to compare fractions of the same numerators. Using these, we were able to see that when the numerators are the same, the smaller the number the greater the fraction. This really helped us when we answered reasoning question.

In RE, we thought of questions we would ask God about the refugee crisis in England. With our questions, we took part in a hot-seating exercise and considered what God's response would be.

During our DT lessons, we discussed what textiles were, where cotton is from and where it is grown. We designed our Christmas decoration, using templates to cut out the felt and sewed the design on to our felt. Some of us have started to join our two parts of felt with blanket stitch. We can't wait to put them on the tree next week!


