

RULE OF LAW

Today in our Collective Worship, the children thought about one of the British Values which was: Rule of law. We talked about why we have laws and who helps to ensure that the laws are followed. We then reflected on our class rules and why it is important that we try to follow them. We listened to John's Gospel where Jesus said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, just as I have loved you." And that this is the most important rule of all.

YEAR R NEWS

We have had an exciting week in Reception. On Monday, we came back to school to find a cottage which had been destroyed by someone. We looked for clues to find out who's cottage it was and who had made all the mess. We discovered that it was Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We wrote wanted posters to try and track down the pesky Goldilocks!



We have been looking at the number 1, 2 and 3 in depth in Maths and have been introduced to the number blocks. The children collected objects in groups of 1, 2 and 3 and demonstrated different ways of showing a number.

We have made some beautiful fireworks pictures using different methods of painting that we had not tried before including marble painting and blow painting.

YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in Maths, we have been focusing on addition. We have been introduced to the addition symbol + and we have begun to use this in our number sentences. We have used counters to visually represent addition in a variety of formats: bar model, in a number line and in a part-whole model.

In English this week, we were introduced to some clues: a little red cape, some furry ears and a tree. We had a think about what traditional tales these clues may be referring to? We made some predictions in our English books about characters and setting.

In RE this week, we reflected on the thoughts and feelings of Noah after God had asked him to build the ark: scared, worried apprehensive? We also wondered how Noah may have felt once the dove returned bearing an olive branch: relief, joy confusion

In Art, we were thinking about celebrations in Diwali (the festival of light) and Bonfire Night. On black card and using fine tipped paint brushes, we made repeated patterns to make beautiful rangoli art and bright exploding fireworks.



In PE/Topic, we had the last lesson of our unit on toys from the past. We thought about the traditional games that children played during playtime in the past. This included: Dusty Bluebells, Duck, Duck Goose, What's the Time Mr Wolf and Double This, Double That.

YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we were very excited to hear from Ernie Arbuckle again. He was being very secretive though! He sent us some envelopes with some sections cut out. Inside was a cover for a book. We had to write down what we could see and ask questions about what we would like to find out. It was a great way to develop our prediction skills. We then had a big reveal to find out what the book was. It is called 'Winter's Child' and we all enjoyed listening to it and making predictions about what will happen.

In Maths, we have been practising using our knowledge of number bonds to 10 to help us find number bonds to 100. If we know that is 4 + 6 = 10, we also know that 40 + 60 = 100. We then moved on to look at how we can add 2 single digit numbers by making 10. For example, if we were calculating 8 + 7, we could partition 7 into 2 and 5, We can then add 2 to 8 to make 10 then add on 5. We discussed how it is easier to add on to 10 because zero is a placeholder for the ones.

In RE we all thought very carefully about Big Questions that only God might have the answer to. such as 'What is Heaven like?'. We thoughtfully shared our ideas and wondered about a lot of interesting things. Adaline wondered, "How do we know how God feels?"

YEAR 3 NEWS

In RE, we explored the feelings we have when we are chosen to do specific jobs in our class. We then considered how Mary felt when she was chosen to be the mother of God's son and why she said 'yes'.

In Maths, we have started to look at the column method for addition and subtraction. We learnt how to set out our calculations and the importance of working from ones to hundreds.

In Science, we discussed different soil types before we devised an experiment to test the permeability of the three main soil types; clay, sand and silt. We used careful measurements to gather and record data and, using this, we drew our own conclusions about soil permeability.

In English this week, Year Three completed their innovated stories of 'The Pied Piper'. They then began publishing them into story books, creating a front cover.

In PE, we took part in 5 a side Tag Rugby games. We implemented all the skills we'd learnt so far. Miss Chappel was super impressed at how well we used communication and teamwork skills.



YEAR 4 NEWS

Year 4 had a good start to the week on Monday by receiving their class reward of a 20 minute party for achieving their class target - well done. They enjoyed playing pass the parcel, eating cake and having a drink.

On Thursday, this week Year 4 had a skipping workshop in the morning where they were able to practise lots of different types of skip ready for our skipping festival in the Spring Term. They learnt: double bounce, speed bounce, pretzel, side swing and cross over. I was really impressed with their skills and am sure that they will work hard between now and the festival to improve their skills.

In RE this week, we started our new topic of Trust in God. The children thought about times when they have had to trust other people and who we trust in our local community. We then thought about times when we need to trust in God and wrote prayers about this.



YEAR 5 NEWS

In English, we are focusing on the Greek Myth 'Pandora's Box'. The children have been able to infer characters feelings from a text and have been able to further explain, using conjunctions, why Pandora was feeling and thinking the way she was when given the box from Zeus. Year 5 were then given their own Pandora' box and were not allowed to touch it for the whole lesson. The children were then given the choice as to whether they wanted to open their box, not knowing what is inside. From this activity the children were able to experience the same curiosity and guilt before and after she opened the box.

In Maths, the children are coming to the end of their addition and subtraction topic. This week we have been focusing on multi-step word problems that involve using more than one operation to find the answer. The children were able to identify the similarities and differences between the calculations to determine whether the answer was going to be greater than or less than without having to actually work out the calculation.

This week in RE, the children have been learning about the Creation Story within the Hindu faith as part of our multi-faith learning. They were able to draw comparisons between the Hindu creation story and the Catholic creation story. On top of this, they all produced lovely story boards to depict this story.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we continued working on long division - we must make sure we know our times tables and write them out when solving the calculation.

In RE, we looked at the five pillars of Islam. We discussed why Muslims must follow these to strengthen their faith and show respect for Allah and Muhammed (PBUH). We wrote explanations in the pillars to show what each one means.

In English, we looked at War poetry and analysed the figurative language used within it. We thought of metaphors, personification and oxymorons and used these within our own poems. Next week, we are going to create a Year 6 anthology of our poems.

In PE, Miss Dowd led a fitness bootcamp - everyone enjoyed taking part in the circuits even if it was a bit tough!


