



CLASS PAGES

YEAR R NEWS

In Phonics this week we have learnt four more sounds including i, n, m and d. We have also learnt three new 'harder to read and spell' words including I, the and no.

As part of Drawing Club this week, we heard the story of the Magic Porridge Pot. The children created some wonderful pictures of the wizard, the wizards house and what sort of potions she might make.

In Maths, we have been learning about matching and sorting. The children enjoyed sorting the autumn objects into different groups including colour, size and texture.

In RE, we continued to learn about the story of The Creation. We thought carefully about how we can care about the world that God has created for us. The children came up with lots of super ideas including not littering, taking care of the animals and using less plastic.

On Wednesday morning, we enjoyed singing at different speeds in our music lesson with Mr Rickson. He brought his metronome and we set it at different speeds and tried to tap to the beat of the music.

YEAR 1 NEWS

As well as leading the assembly this morning, Year 1 have also started looking at our new book in English which is about Rosa Parks, who we will be learning about as part of Black History month. The children have used adjectives and nouns to describe what Rosa Parks looks like and have enjoyed playing in our new bus in class.

In Maths, we have been practising using words such as: more, less, equal and the same to compare numbers within ten. We have also been saying 1 less than other numbers.

In Geography, we recapped the four countries in the United Kingdom and their capital cities then we moved on to looking at famous features in each country such as Big Ben, Loch Ness, Millennium Stadium and the Giant's Causeway.

Our Science work focused on the change in weather and how the day light hours are getting shorter in the Autumn. The children made special dials to show this.

IMPORTANT - **PLEASE READ**: Next Wednesday (11th October), Year 1 will be visited by 'Bikes Future' who will work with all the children in small groups during the day helping them to ride balance or first pedal bikes. Children should wear their PE kits on this day. This will be instead of PE on Thursday so they will need to wear their school uniform on Thursday. Thank you.

YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we have been busy writing our diary entries as the old woman in 'A Squash and a Squeeze'. Everybody has been working hard to think of one sentence at a time. We are trying to slow down to ensure our writing makes full sense with the correct punctuation. We rehearsed our sentences, wrote it and then read it to check it made sense. We are also trying to take great care of our handwriting.

In Maths, we have been practising comparing objects and numbers. We have been working hard to remember the < less than and > more than symbols to help us compare. We have also worked hard to put numbers on number-lines and estimate the position of numbers on a number-line.

In Science, we carried out an exciting investigation to find out what kind of conditions woodlice prefer. We used a choice chamber which was split into four sections. Section one was light and dry, section 2 was light and damp, section three was dark and dry and section four was dark and damp. We made predictions about which area the woodlice would go to. We found out that woodlice prefer a dark, damp area.

In RE, we enjoyed acting out the story of baby Moses. We then wrote letters as if we were Moses' sister Miriam to her friend to tell them what had happened.

YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we used the correct punctuation for direct speech and began to use fronted adverbials in our sentences. We had a Quickwrite competition where the children had to start with a simple sentence and add different grammatical devices. It was a bit messy but really showed the power of editing!

In Maths, we compared and ordered numbers to 1000. The children played a game ordering different number cards, and used the greater than, less than and equal to symbols with place value counters. They also completed lots of challenges!

In History, the children analysed artefacts from the Palaeolithic to Iron Age, thinking about what they told us and creating 'I wonder...' questions for all the things we still don't know about them.

In Science, we learned about 'the Father of Modern Geology' Dr James Hutton, and his ideas which we still use today. It is amazing to think how much one person has influenced the study of rocks and soils!

YEAR 4 NEWS

A super week in Year 4. We have all been working really hard and trying to work together as a team to achieve our class target; 'everybody listening on 5'.

In Maths, we have been looking at rounding to 10, 100 and 1000. We used a rounding rhyme to help us. 5-9 climb up the vine, 0-4 slide down to the floor. We have also been busy challenging each other on TTRS. Keep practicing this at home, logins are in your Maths homework book.

In English, we have been writing poetry called 'I am a Roman Soldier'. We worked together as a group, wrote our own poems and then we performed them to the class.

In RE, we learned about the Jewish Holy book, the Torah. We came up with our own ten commandments as important rules that we should all live by. We also used our iPads to write a dialogue between Abraham and Sarah.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths, we have begun our new topic of addition and subtraction. At the beginning of the week the children were recognising different mental strategies they could use to help them solve different addition and subtraction calculations. For example, if 5+4 = 9, then they can use this to help them work out 50+40 and 50,000 + 40,000 without the need for a written method.

In English, we have been focusing on creating opinions and using these options to plan an opinion-based article that is centred around the four historical female mathematicians featured in our 'Hidden Figures' novel. The children read through an example of an opinion article on Kamala Harris, and made links between her story and that of the four Hidden Figures mathematicians.

On Wednesday, we enjoyed our Saints Day. Following a morning of research, the children had the opportunity to create their own PowerPoints that documented key aspects of St Francis' life. In the afternoon, the children decorated their own biscuits to represent an animal. They had lots of fun!

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have continued our learning on multiplication and division. We began by looking at rules of divisibility where we learnt that if the digits sum to a multiple of 3, then the number is divisible by 3.

In Guided Reading, we are enjoying reading our Class book - Over the Line. Currently, we know that Jack (the main character) plays for Huddersfield Town and has just won 3 -0 against Arsenal. However, Jack is stuck in a situation where he doesn't know whether to continue playing professional football or whether he should enlist for the war.

On Thursday, we enjoyed working with a poet to write poems about: school, refuge and conkers. We included lots of figurative language to engage the reader. The poet said that everyone in Y6 worked incredibly hard and created some great poems!

In Science, we looked at classification using classification keys. Instead of classifying animals, we classified 'liquorice allsort' sweets. We had to think about what yes or no questions would help us to identify a specific sweet.
