YEAR R NEWS

We hope you and your families had a lovely Christmas. Thank you very much for your kind gifts. We have had a very busy few days back in Reception this week.

We have written all about our holiday news and in Literacy we have been reading 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. We have been thinking about where we would like to go in a rocket. Lucas wrote he would like to go to the moon and meet an alien. While he was there he would like to play snakes and ladders!

In RE, we have been thinking about how we can show our love for Jesus. On Thursday morning we attended our first Mass in church.

In PE, we have been listening to different pieces of music and thought about how they make us feel before moving in different ways.



YEAR 1 NEWS

What a fantastic start to the new term we have had this week. Y1 have returned with renewed vigour and a wonderful attitude to learning.

This week in Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of fact families. During our time in Y1 we have been working hard to secure our understanding of addition and subtraction. We are beginning to see the relationship between the two and to understand how they are related.

In English, we have been writing a chronological account of our Christmas holidays. We used time adverbials to structure our writing. We enjoyed sharing all of our exciting holiday news including what we received from Father Christmas.

In RE, we have been reflecting on the notion of belonging and what it feels like to belong to our family and how special that makes us feel. We reflected on our own family and who we live with at home. We thought about the important qualities of belonging within our school community.

On Thursday, we celebrated the Epiphany with a whole school mass in church. As always Y1's behaviour was exemplary and they sang beautifully.

We finished our busy week with a trip to The Carriageworks Theatre to see Aladdin. We had a fantastic time and thoroughly enjoyed the atmosphere and production.



YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we are enjoying our new text 'Orion and the Dark'. We started by looking at a word cloud with words taken from the blurb and made predictions about what we thought the book might be about. We then discovered Orion, the boy in the story, is scared of lots of different things. We used commas in a list when writing the different things, he was scared of.

In Maths, we have started our topic about money. We practised recognising coins and then counting different amounts in pounds and pence. We realised that our multiples of 2, 5 and 10 can help us when counting groups of coins.


We started our Art topic based on developing a variety of skills. This week we focused on developing our shading skills. We looked the artwork of Nancy McCroskey and created our own version of 'Suite in Black, White and Gray'.





YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we have started to read a new book called The Tear Thief. We have found out about the author and the illustrator who created the beautiful pictures.





In P.E, the children have started to learn the skills of Handball including ball control skills and working together as a team.

In R.E, we have been finding out more about The Epiphany and the symbolism of the gifts that the Wise Men brought for baby Jesus.

In History, we answered the question 'What can we learn about life in the Stone Age from Skara Brae?' We looked and different assumptions made from what has been discovered at Skara Brae and collected evidence to support them. We them wrote our own assumptions based on what we had learnt.

YEAR 4 NEWS

In English, we have consolidated our understanding of adjectives and verbs as well as learning about the role of determiners. The children used thesauruses and word banks to find powerful language and also put their knowledge of features of report writing to use in creating leaflets all about sound.



In Maths, we have been using the 6 and 9 times table to solve multiplication and division problems, as well as spotting patterns that can help us. Very few children have been on TT Rockstars this week at home - please encourage your children to log on often in preparation for their Times Table Check in the summer.

In RE, our new topic is 'Celebrating the Mass'. We discussed why Christians go to Mass, and the children shared their thoughts and emotions about why Mass is important to them. We also learned why Sunday is a special day for Christians.

In DT, the children explored frame structures with toothpicks and mini-marshmallows, which supported them in creating their own plans for their pavilions. It was wonderful to see the stable structures they came up with!

In Science, the children used all of their learned knowledge about sound to create leaflets, and experimented with different objects in the classroom in an enquiry about pitch. They used lots of specific vocabulary in their discussion and writing.

YEAR 5 NEWS

For the next couple of weeks in English, we are going to be looking at poetry and this week we started looking at the poem, "The Listeners" written by Walter de la Mere. It was written in 1912 so some of the vocabulary was unfamiliar to the children so we made predictions as to what they might mean using the text to help us, we then used dictionaries to see if our predictions were correct.



In Maths, we have been looking at finding the perimeter of different shapes and using a ruler to measure different lengths to the nearest mm. The children have been trying to apply their knowledge to solve reasoning questions.

Our focus in RE this half term is "Inspirational People". This week, the children talked about what they think makes someone inspirational and, thought about which virtues were most important for inspirational people to show.

In PE this half term, we will be doing Gymnastics. This week, the children practised the arch shape, dish shape, front support, side support & back support as well as performing counterbalances & trying to sequence them together.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In English, we have been analysing the features of a formal and informal letter: looking at the similarities and differences in both structure and language. We enjoyed completing a letter of complaint about a faulty car!

Our new topic in Maths is position and direction. This week, we have been learning about the four quadrants, as well as plotting coordinates and shapes within them.

Year 6 are now able to not only say what kind of house they live in, but also describe the rooms in their house in French following our lesson on Thursday.

In R.E, we studied the life of Oscar Romero: considering how his brave actions to defend the poor in El Salvador link to our current topic of Justice and the ways in which his legacy is still felt today.


