Please note that these checks cost the school a considerable amount of money and so we must be sure that you will be able to commit time regularly.


## SCHOOL INFORMATION


#### **POPPY APPEAL**


We raised an amazing £314.32 for the Poppy Appeal. Your poppy supports the armed forces community past and present.

Thank you to Year 3 for leading the Collective Worship this morning. They told us all about Saint Nicholas, whose Feast Day it was on Wednesday. Saint Nicholas helped a poor family by sneaking into their home at night and putting money in their stockings that were hanging up by the fireplace, which reminded Year 3 of Father Christmas. The children treated us to two songs, which they sang beautifully.

This week, we thought about our new virtue of patience. We talked about what patience means and how we have to show patience at this time of year by waiting for all the exciting things that will happen at Christmas. Over the next few weeks, we will be encouraging the children to:

Accept things that they can not change with a smile	Do things now to help them in the future
Be patient with themselves when things don't go to plan	Be patient with other people when they make mistakes

#### **CONFIRMATION**

Congratulations to the 24 children who received the Sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday evening. The Bishop commented on how well prepared all of the children were and they certainly made us feel very proud. A massive thank you to all of their family and friends for helping them prepare for this occasion. Thank you also to Father Nicholas, Mrs Russell and Rita from the parish for helping the children on their faith journey.



Of course, this is not the end of their faith journey but another step along the way. In the Bishop's homily, he told the children how they might not feel any different after receiving the Sacrament and may even think what was all the fuss about. However, as they go forward in their lives we pray that the gifts of the Holy Spirit will help and guide them. The children will be presented with their certificates at the end term Mass on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> December.

#### **CAROL SERVICE**

Thank you to all of the people who have said that they will attend the Carol Service next week with the children. We shall be practising it with the children next week. We look forward to seeing you in Church on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> December at 4pm.

#### TREE DRESSING SERVICE

On Monday afternoon, we gathered as a school to put the decorations that the children have made on our School Christmas Tree. We started the service by learning about Saint Boniface who used the triangular shape of the fir tree to describe the Trinity of God the Father, God the Son and the Holy Spirit.

We then listened to readings from the Prophet Isaiah, and the Gospel of Luke. During the service, we also learnt about how Christmas trees were introduced in this country in 1834 by Prince Albert.

## **CLASS PAGES**

#### YEAR R NEWS

A fantastic week in Reception. We have been putting our phonics into action this week with lots of lovely activities around the classroom to complete. We have also written a very important letter to Father Christmas letting him know what we would like for Christmas. They will be posted to the North Pole today and we hope to get a letter back from him soon. There is an extra copy of the children's letters in their bags so you can see the fantastic progress the children have made with their writing and so you can see what they have asked Father Christmas for.

We have loved playing in our post office role play area; writing, posting and delivering letters. Our Nativity is coming on brilliantly and we can't wait to show you all our hard work. Keep practicing your lines at home.

In RE, we have been learning about the story of the very first Christmas. We know all the people (and animals) who were at the birth of Jesus and have been using our class nativity set to act out the story.

We also enjoyed going to church and singing with our buddies at the Christmas Tree Festival. The children sang beautifully and we were extremely proud of them and heard lots of wonderful comments.

#### YEAR 1 NEWS

In English, we finished reading "Coming Home". The children used adjectives to describe the different aspects of the journey made by the Robin and they thought about how the Robin was feeling at different times.

We have continued to look at subtraction in Maths and have been calculating the answer to first, then, now stories. For example, first there were 5 birds in a tree, then 2 flew away and now there are 3 left. We have used counters and clothes pegs to help us with our calculations.

In our History topic, we looked at pictures of houses from different historical periods. Needless to say, the children were fascinated to know how people went to the toilet in the past when there were no flushing toilets!!!

As we approach Christmas, the children are learning about some of the pictures used by Christians to celebrate the Christmas story. They labelled the different characters in a crib scene and sorted Christmas pictures into those that feature in the Nativity story and those which don't.

The children have been given information about costumes for the play. Please could these be in school by Friday 15th December? Thank you.

#### YEAR 2 NEWS

In Maths, we have continued to develop our knowledge of subtraction and are gaining confidence in using base ten and recording our working pictorially to support our understanding further.

In English, we looked at a variety of winter poems and compared them. We discussed our likes and dislikes and what connections we could see about the poems. We then thought about winter and used our senses to help us describe what we might see, hear, feel, smell and taste in winter. We used our ideas to create our very own winter themed poems.

In RE, we have been reflecting on how the shepherds must have felt on the hillside when the angels appeared with their message. We all thought carefully about their feelings as they journeyed to Bethlehem and when they arrived and met the Newborn king.

Year 2 enjoyed designing their own finger puppets in DT this week. We thought carefully about our designs and the colours we could use. Next week we will be using a template to help us cut out our designs in felt. We are really looking forward to making our finger puppets.

#### YEAR 3 NEWS

We have had an extremely busy week with the Scholastic Book Fair, making a mosaic to go outside the library and taking part in the Christmas Tree Festival at the Parish Church!

In English, we made decision wheels and used modal verbs to show the different decisions the Mayor of Hamelin could make about paying the Pied Piper. We also enjoyed reading lots of different books for Book-vent.

In Maths, the children used their number bonds to 10 to quickly find complements to 100 in addition calculations. We used the White Rose digital Rekenrek to show the complements clearly. We then focused on checking our answers to addition and subtraction calculations. We learnt how to estimate answers and use the inverse operation.

In Science, we created bar charts to show the results of our soil permeability experiment, as well as creating compost bins with tiger worms, food scraps and paper. We learned about the different layers in soil and how it can change.

In RE, we continued learning about Advent. We looked at different Christmas cards and found all the images which reminded us of the real meaning of Christmas. We then designed a door for our class advent calendar, including images and words which remind us of the story of Jesus' birth.

#### YEAR 4 NEWS

It's been another busy week in Year 4! In Geography, we identified the capital cities of different European countries and looked at some of their features. The children then used their knowledge to create their own multiple-choice quizzes for their friends to answer.

In English, we started planning our own narratives, inspired by The Iron Man. The children created their own unique characters, decided on their different features and then planned the build up to their stories.

In Computing, the children started learning how to edit their audio recordings. Once happy with their recordings, the children then trimmed any parts of the files they didn't need at experimented with adding background music.

In Maths, the children have been working on their times tables. Focusing on the 11 and 12 times table, the children used their knowledge of other multiplication facts to support their understanding.

#### YEAR 5 NEWS

In English, we have been focusing on narrative poetry. At the beginning of the week, the children created journey maps which mapped out Shaun and the Lost Things journey to the odds and ends department. From this, we looked at how we can tell this story of the journey through a poem and began to look at how we can use rhyming couplets with our poems. The children came up with some fantastic ideas which we used to create a whole class model before they then went on to write their own.

In Maths, we have continued our fractions topic by concentrating on converting mixed numbers and improper fractions. The children were able to recognise why we need to convert improper fractions as we can't have more parts than the whole itself. They were able to use bar representations to spot the wholes and then work out the remaining fractions.

In Science, the children had a fantastic time learning about air resistance and created paper airplanes to test the effect of air resistance and look at aerodynamics. The children were able to identify where the different forces were acting on different parts of the plane and we discussed how the structures of the planes can enable them to go further than others.

#### YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting fractions of different denominators and mixed numbers. We looked at it step by step and were able to confidently say each step in the method. Mr Gilhooly was impressed at our understanding and said that we should be the teacher!

In English, we continued to read Anne Frank's diary and have finally read up to the part when she moves into the Annex. We completed the axis of emotions which depicts Anne's emotions throughout her move into the Annex. With this, we wrote a diary from the perspective of Anne describing the events of moving into the Annex. In our writing, we tried to use colons and semi-colons (that we had learned this week).

During our RE session, we discussed individuals that fought for justice, and particularly looked at the work of Martin Luther King Jr. We watched his 'I have a dream' speech and thought about all the prejudice that black people faced in the USA. After talking about all the segregation and injustices black people faced, we wrote our own speech in the style of MLK and linked it to the British Values and Pope Francis quotes. Our writing was so passionate about fighting for justice in our world today.
