YEAR R NEWS

What a busy but wonderful week in Reception. We have enjoyed learning all about Chinese New Year. We learnt about why each year is named after an animal and enjoyed learning about which animal represents the year we were born. We made Chinese lanterns to decorate our classroom.

In Literacy, we focused on the story 'Peace at Last'. We enjoyed creating some super pictures to represent the setting of the story and thought about a new place for Daddy Bear to try and get some sleep.

In Maths, we have been exploring capacity. We explored different sized containers and identified which held the most/least. We identified that taller containers didn't always hold the most water.

It was lovely to see so many children come back to school on Wednesday evening for the Bedtime story session. We had a lovely cosy evening, enjoying hot chocolate and some of our favourite stories.

Many thanks to all the parents/ grandparents that have attended Stay and Play this half term. It has been lovely to see the children showing you around their classroom and engaging in lots of play! We plan to offer this again next half term. More information to follow!

YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in English, the children have continued to practise their writing. This week, they have been thinking about what a thoughtful toy bus might do to help around school. The children have been trying to remember to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

In Maths, the children have looked at ordering numbers to 20 using cubes to help them. After half term, the children will be using their knowledge of numbers of 20 to complete adding and subtracting questions.

In RE, the children have continued to learn about the signs used in Baptism and the children have also learnt about how new life is celebrated in Judaism.

The children loved using the apparatus in PE this week as part of our gymnastics work. They have been practising their jumping, balancing, moving and agility skills.

YEAR 2 NEWS

In Maths, we have started our new topic on money. We started of by counting money in pence, then pounds, then pounds and pence! We are all getting a good grasp of being able to make different amounts using both coins and notes.

In English, we have been focusing on using simple past tense verbs. We identified past tense verbs within a postcard text. We also spotted some irregular past tense verbs such as write becomes wrote and eat becomes ate. We then used our knowledge to write our own postcard home from the seaside!

As part of our Geography work about the coastline, we found out about coastal erosion. We learnt that it is caused when the waves hit the coastline and bits of rock crumble away until eventually it collapses. We built a cliff out of sand and made waves until it collapsed. We then built another cliff and created a sea defence around it using pebbles. The sea defence protected the cliff well.

In RE, we thought about how Jesus was a 'Good News' person and why. We then thought of ways that we could be 'Good News' people too and how sometimes this can be difficult.



YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we drafted and published our newspaper reports. Mr Gilhooly visited the classroom during publishing and was very impressed by the care the children were taking. The children also worked as teams to edit others' work, checking for spelling and grammar mistakes and helping each other improve.

In Maths, we learnt to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. We used lots of practical apparatus to support us in visualising it, partitioning the numbers into tens and one to break it down into steps.

In RE, we thought about what it means to follow Jesus' teachings. We reflected on the Good News, and how we would feel in heaven. We also discussed the joys and challenges of following Jesus, and how to act out his message.

In Geography, we learned about different types of volcanoes and their features. We created models of the extinct volcano Arthur's Seat in Edinburgh, and the active volcano Eyjafjallajökull in Iceland.

In Science, we presented our findings from our science investigation, exploring which surface is the most slippery by measuring frictional forces. We produced bar charts before analysing our findings.

YEAR 4 NEWS

In English, we wrote non-chronological reports about rivers. We prepared by making notes and doing research before compiling all we had found in to our reports.

In Maths, we continued to work on multiplying and dividing 3 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers. In Year 4, we use informal methods and so have been using part- part- whole models to help us with our calculations.

In PE, we enjoyed using the apparatus to practise the skills we have been learning over the past few weeks. This includes jumping, balancing, moving and sequencing a gymnastics routine.

On Friday, we celebrated the feast of St Brigid. We learned about her life, made crosses, reflected on her life and said prayers to her whilst tying ribbons to our prayer tree. We then designed a section of a cloak which we are going to sew together to make a large cloak like St Brigid's. We enjoyed wearing our own clothes for our class' special day too.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In English, we have been focusing on sequencing events, from the 'Freedom Bird' book, as well as inserting verbs ending -ing at the beginning of their sentences. The children identified the different verbs within a passage from the book and were able to recognise how we can manipulate these verbs to end with -ing. They then used these verbs at the beginning of their sentences to create fronted adverbials.

In Geography, we have been looking at the year of a farmer. We discussed how a farmer's year never stops and they have certain tasks they need to complete throughout the different seasons. The children were able to debate which season would be the hardest for a farmer to work through and they explained challenges faced by farmers throughout their year.

In PE, the children had the opportunity to go to Prince Henry's and take part in a World & Inclusive Sports festival. The children took part in mini games of sports against Otley All Saints, which they have learned throughout this half-term. The children had a fantastic time and showed great teamwork and sportsmanship.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we looked at scaling shapes by reducing and enlarging by different scale factors. We enjoyed drawing the new shapes out and worked out the perimeter and the area of shapes too. Additionally, we challenged ourselves to answer a range of reasoning questions - including SATs ones.

In RE, we looked at the Penitential Act where we discussed how we must say sorry before we take communion. We linked this to the parable of the Forgiving Father and how God is like the father and we are his children and he will always forgive us. After this, we looked at signs and actions that we do during mass and what they mean.

All the class enjoyed taking part in Bikeability this week where they learned to safely ride their bike. When they mastered this, they were able to use their skills on the road. Well done!

For Mental Health week, we created a wellbeing toolkit where we wrote about trusted adults, feelings, relaxation techniques, self care and things that make you happy. We wrote down ways that would help us and drew pictures. The toolkits look great!


