

This week, we reflected on our class saints to celebrate All Saints Day which was during half term. The children listened to the Beatitudes from the Gospel of Matthew and thought about how they can live them out.

This week's statement was: I know how to look after myself.

The children thought about different ways they need to look after themselves, some of their ideas were:

to drink water

to eat healthily •

to get plenty of sleep

to wash regularly

We are all special and God loves us all so it is important we look after ourselves and each other.

On Thursday, we thought about the British Value of Rule of Law during our Collective Worship. We recapped our school rules and why it is important to have these. We then listened to John's Gospel to hear the rule Jesus gave us which is to love our neighbour as ourselves.

YEAR R NEWS

In Maths, we have been sorting the numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have been showing the numbers in different ways and sorting objects into groups. We have also explored one more and one less for those numbers - thinking about our text Goldilocks: 'There are 3 bears, but baby bear is tired so he goes to bed. Now we have 1 less. How many bears are left?' or' There were 4 conkers in the pot, but Shirley the squirrel took one away. How many are left?'

In Literacy, we have been sequencing the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We are also reviewing our sounds in Phonics - please keep practising these at home- reading and writing in their sound books!

In Music, we have begun practising our Christmas Carols and nativity songs- the children have done tremendously.

We have also created some beautiful remembrance pictures of poppies and have explored different ways to design them.

YEAR 1 NEWS

In English this week, we have started reading our new book, "Peepo" which will link in to our new History topic of homes later in the term. The children have enjoyed talking and writing about what they can see in each picture.

Our focus in Maths this week has been addition. The children have been adding objects together, writing addition facts in a different order and practising their number bonds to ten.

In PE this half term we are choreographing a dance to the song, "I just can't wait to be king" from the Lion King. This week, the children chose animals that were in the Lion King and chose movements for them. They chose lions, elephants, mice and hyenas.

On Thursday morning, the children had a nice surprise as our new rug for the carpet had arrived and it looks lovely!

YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we were very excited to hear from Ernie Arbuckle again. He was being very secretive though! He sent us some envelopes with some sections cut out. Inside was a cover for a book. We had to write down what we could see and ask questions about what we would like to find out. It was a great way to develop our prediction skills. We then had a big reveal to find out what the book was. It is called 'Winter's Child' and we all enjoyed listening to it and making predictions about what will happen.

In Maths, we have been looking at how we can add 2 single digit numbers by making 10. For example, if we were calculating 8 + 7, we could partition 7 into 2 and 5, We can then add 2 to 8 to make 10 then add on 5. We discussed how it is easier to add on to 10 because zero is a placeholder for the ones. We found out that we can also use this concept to add three 1-digit numbers together.

In RE, we all thought very carefully about Big Questions that only God might have the answer to. such as 'What is Heaven like?' We thoughtfully shared our ideas and wondered a lot of interesting things. Maisy wondered, "How many stars are there in the sky?" and Grace asked, "Did God create plants first or the seeds?"

YEAR 3 NEWS

In RE, Year 3 learned about the Muslim 'Aqiqah' ceremony, which Muslims hold when a new baby arrives into their family. We found out that they shave the baby's head and show gratitude to Allah (peace be upon him) for His blessings.

In English, we were introduced to our new book - The Pied Piper of Hamelin. We discussed the features of fairytales before making predictions about the story. We look forward to reading more next week.

In Maths, we were practising subtracting over ones and tens. We used place value counters to help us when partitioning numbers to subtract.

In PE, we practised the skill of agility. We played different games and races practising turning and responding quickly.

In History, we created replica stone age jewellery and Stonehenge out of clay. We enjoyed getting our hands dirty and using our creative skills to make accurate looking replicas.

In Science, we discussed different soil types before we devised an experiment to test the permeability of the three main soil types; clay, sand and silt. We used careful measurements to gather and record data and, using this, we drew our own conclusions about soil permeability.

YEAR 4 NEWS

Year 4 have had a fantastic start to the second half of the Autumn term. Inspired by their last Science topic and visit to Yorkshire Water, they have written an explanation text about the water cycle. Focusing on the use of technical vocabulary and the use of complex sentences, they have produced some really detailed explanations.

In Maths, we have been recapping column subtraction and the process for making an exchange. The children have worked really hard to ensure they have been answering calculations accurately, using manipulatives to support them in doing so.

In DT this term, the children will be making Christmas stockings. We started our design process by looking at Christmas stockings that are already on the market and analysing both the visual appeal, and functionality of these.

In PE, we worked on fitness - focusing on core strength - by completing a range of activities and trying to improve our flexibility and stability.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths this week, we have been focusing on factors and common factors. The children were able to recognise different factors of numbers using arrays as well as using Venn diagrams to help them identify the common factors of two numbers. As a class we spent time highlighting the differences between multiples of a number and factors of a number.

In English, we have started to watch the video version of 'The Lost Thing' picture and story book written by Shaun Tang. The children have produced some wonderful show descriptive sentences and pieces of writing that describe the scene and the characteristics of the main character using personification, expanded noun phrases, similes and metaphors.

In History, we have also started our new topic that is focused around Ancient Greece. The children were being archaeologists this week and were ordering different artefacts in order of excavation according to their dates.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been practising our mental maths strategies to support our arithmetic skills. During the week, we developed ways in which we can answer questions in our head rather than writing a formal calculation. We discussed the importance of using our known facts to help us with calculations too. Additionally, we looked at BIDMAS - order of operations - which helps us to know which order to complete a number sentence with multiple operations in it.

In English, we've looked at famous war poetry - In Flanders Field and Dulce et Decorum Est. We analysed some of the figurative language in the poem which made them picturable. This helped us to think of similes, metaphors, oxymorons and personification linked to war images. We will then use them in our own poems. During our assembly, we performed In Flanders Field after learning it off by heart.

In RE, we learnt about the importance of The Five Pillars of Islam. We really enjoyed learning about how Muslims follow these pillars as they are their core beliefs and practices of faith.


