### **CLASS NEWS**

#### YEAR R NEWS

In Literacy, we have been learning about different people that help us. This week we have focused on the role of Police Officers. We thought carefully about the different jobs the police do and did some super writing!

In Maths, we have been learning about numbers 9 and 10. We practised representing the numbers on ten frames and part-whole models. We also sorted pictures according those that represented 9 and those that represented 10. At the end of the week, we learnt about putting numbers in the correct order.

In RE, we began our new topic of 'Joy and Sorrow.' We learnt about the importance of being kind to each other. We thought of different acts of kindness we could do in the classroom this week. We have also been exploring the virtue 'Charity.' During our circle time, we reflected on the importance of loving thy neighbour as we love ourselves and how Charity is an act of love.



#### YEAR 1 NEWS

In RE, we have reflected on how we prepare spiritually throughout the forty days of Lent. We thought about the three traditional practices to be taken up with renewed vigour during this time: prayer, fasting and almsgiving and identified the different ways that we have been doing this CAFOD Faith lunch, Toast Tuesdays etc...

This week in Maths, we've been learning about position and direction. We practised our **clockwise** and **anti-clockwise quarter turns** by moving around the classroom.

In Topic, we have been learning about the palaeontologist Mary Anning who uncovered and discovered what turned out to be the first complete Ichthyosaur fossil to be found. This was an important discovery because **it challenged the way scientists had thought the natural world had developed**. The children had fun, drawing and making fossils and putting together dinosaur bones.

We enjoyed our PE lesson this week when we were able to use the PE apparatus in the hall. Using the climbing frame, low angled ladders, walking planks and gymnastics benches we practised our balancing skills and how to land appropriately.

After the fabulous buildings that Y1, designed and built out of recycling last week, we wrote about the materials we had used and who/what they were designed for.



#### YEAR 2 NEWS

In English this week, we have been focusing on our grammar and punctuation. We have been practising using capital letters for proper nouns. We learnt that the days of the week and the months of the year are all proper nouns. Some of us are really good at knowing the months of the year. A few of us need a little more practice.

In Maths, we have continued to practise our division skills. We have developed our knowledge of dividing by 2, 5 and 10. We can now recognise any number which can be divided by 5 and 10 by looking at the final digit in the number. We are all looking forwards to starting a new maths topic next week.

As part of our Geography work this week, we talked about the different seasons and which months are in which season. We went on a lovely walk around the grounds to look for the early signs of springtime.

In RE, we discussed each part of a Mass service and what we should do at each part, including the Offertory, Consecration and the during the readings. We then also found out about the different things we would find in a Catholic church and what they are used for or symbolise.



#### YEAR 3 NEWS

This week in Maths, Year 3 continued their learning on money. We worked on converting pence and pounds before moving on to adding money.

In English, we carried out a prediction lesson based on our new book, "The Pied Piper of Hamelin" by Michael Morpurgo. We heard a theme tune and made predictions of what the story could be about. We were then shown the front cover, then the title, to add more information to our predictions. We then did a drama activity, imagining we were a character who lived in the town in the first illustration. Miss Chappel shouted, 'There's a rat!' and we had to freeze frame our reactions, before sharing our thoughts.

In DT, we began designing a cushion, choosing an endangered animal to feature on the front. We started practising the running stitch - the stitch that we will use to applique an animal on to our cushion.

On Thursday it was our Class Mass. Year 3 read and sang beautifully. Thank you to all the parents/carers who joined us.



#### YEAR 4 NEWS

In English, the children have been introduced to our new book, 'The Matchbox Diary'. It was inside an envelope with a few holes that showed a little of the front cover, so the children made predictions about what the story could be about. Eventually, the book was uncovered and the children developed their predictions with conjunctions, manipulating the sentence structure so it began with a subordinate clause.

In Maths, we looked at mixed numbers and fractions greater than 1. We learned about how to write improper fractions as mixed numbers and used bar models to visualise this.

In Science, we thought about everything we already know about staying safe around electricity. They used this knowledge to create posters to teach the younger children in school.

In RE, we reflected on the belief that Jesus is both fully God and fully Man. We thought about the differences between a human and God, and used some complex vocabulary such as 'omnipotent' and 'immortal'. The children then worked in groups to find different Bible references and decide whether they showed Jesus as human or divine.

#### YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths, we have been continuing our work on fractions. This week, we have been adding mixed numbers and we have also just started subtracting fractions. The children are getting really good at changing the denominators so that they can do these calculations.

For our Science lesson this week, we started by going outside so the children could see push and pull forces in action as they moved a ball around the playground. Inside, we then used force meters to measure the force needed to pull our shoes across the tables and carpet.

In English, the children had to find different grammatical features in an explanation text. These included: relative clauses, subordinating conjunctions, adverbs and expanded noun phrases.

With Mrs James in music, the children enjoyed using tuned and untuned percussion instruments to create a shimmer working in groups.

#### YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been recapping the area and perimeter of rectilinear and triangle shapes. With the parallelograms, we drew some on squared paper, cut them out and moved part of it to make a rectangle to work out the area.

In English, we have started reading Kensuke's Kingdom. We began by making inferences about what the story was going to be about. After reading the first chapter, we looked at common SATs questions and had a go at answering them.

On Tuesday, we celebrated Mass and the theme was Jesus, the Bread of Life. Father Lawrie discussed in detail during his homily about the importance of not wasting words but acting upon them to have a positive impact.

During Science, we looked at Carl Linnaeus work on the classification system. We researched the classification system for different animal, plants and amphibians.




