

REMEMBRANCE DAY



SICKNESS AND DIARRHOEA




VIRTUE - PRAYER

CLASS PAGES

YEAR R NEWS

We have had a lovely week in Reception. On Friday afternoon, we had a very special service to officially welcome us to the St Joseph's family. Our year 6 buddies presented us with a candle and our parents and families were there to celebrate us too. We have all settled into school so well and are all a very special member of the St Joseph's family.

In Maths, we have been sorting the numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have been showing the numbers in different ways and sorting objects in to groups.

In Literacy, we have been sequencing the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We are also reviewing our sounds in Phonics - please keep practising these at home!

We have created some beautiful remembrance pictures of poppies and have explored different ways to design them.



YEAR 1 NEWS

In Maths this week, we have been learning about Number Bonds. A number bond lets us split numbers in useful ways. They show how numbers join together, and how they break down into component parts.

In Science, we have been learning about materials and where they can be found. We went on a materials hunt and labelled the outdoor area according to whether it was comprised of glass, wood, plastic or metal we thought about the suitability of these materials.

This week in RE, we have been thinking about Remembrance Sunday. We learnt about this special occasion and why we wear a poppy. We also learnt about the Annunciation- the special message that Mary received from the Angel Gabriel that she would have a baby called Jesus and he would be the Son of God.

In English, we have been thinking about the characteristics of Little Red Riding Hood. We thought about her feelings towards the wolf and how somebody may describe her appearance.

We have now given out the roles for our Nativity and costumes required. If your child has lines please can you help them to learn these. We have a number of costumes in school and may be able to provide one of these for your child. Please refer to the letter sent home with your child on Thursday.



YEAR 2 NEWS

In Maths, we have continued to work hard with adding 2-digit numbers to a 1-digit number. We are getting good at making groups of ten ones and exchanging them for one ten. We use base ten to help us with this and began to practise recording it in our books.

In English, we have continued to enjoy the story 'Winter's Child'. We are using some exciting and interesting vocabulary to describe the beautiful setting. We were all excited when Ernie Arbuckle came to visit us. He left us a piece of writing for us to help him with. We worked hard to edit and improve Ernie's writing and we are sure he will be very pleased with it.

As part of our RE work this week, we have been learning about the Holy Trinity. We discussed how one person can be a sister, a daughter and a niece, just as God can be three in one: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We also enjoyed learning the 'Glory Be' Prayer.

We all enjoyed wearing our odd socks on Monday to start Anti-bullying Week. We have given lots of thought about who we can reach out to if we feel we are being bullied and what to do if we see someone being bullied. Together, we made a Reach Out Wreath which included important messages such as 'Challenge it to change it' and 'Reach out if you see it'.

YEAR 3 NEWS

In RE, we explored the Visitation (when Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth) and looked at how we could help others, like Mary helped Elizabeth. Additionally, we discussed the meaning of the Hail Mary.

In Maths, Year 3 learnt to add using column addition with an exchange.

In English, we started our new book 'The First Drawing'. We discovered some cave paintings in our classroom and we used observation and inference skills to interpret their meanings. We then researched the Stone Age, creating a mind map of everything we found out

In PE, we began our unit on badminton! We learnt the basics, getting to grips with the shuttlecock and racket.

In PSHE, we learnt about anti-bullying. We discussed how being kind and unkind affects people around us. We then thought about what bullying means and how we can reach out if we or those around us are a victim of bullying. We put together some ideas to make our school a 'reach-out' friendly, bully-free zone.



YEAR 4 NEWS

In Maths this week, the children have been learning about area. The children have been calculating area by counting squares and have been comparing area using greater than and less than vocabulary.

We started reading our new book in English this week - Roman Diary. At the beginning of the week, we made predictions as to what it might be about using the front cover to help us. We have then started reading the book and have identified the features of a diary. This has linked to our new History topic - Roman Britain. The children have thought of questions that they would like to know the answers to so I think we are going to be very busy between now and Christmas!

In PSHE, as part of anti-bullying week the children thought about the different types of bullying and what can be done to stop it.

Last week in Art, the children made their own leaf print boards which this week they had fun using to make pattern prints.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths this week, we have started our new topic of multiplication and division. We have spent time understanding and identifying different multiples, common multiples and factors. We used counters and arrays and 100 squares to help support the children in visibly seeing the different factors of numbers.

In English, the children have spent time analysing and identifying the structure and language features included in writing a newspaper article such as using different conjunctions, fronted adverbials and adverbial phrases, parenthesis, the headline, the orientation and the reorientation of an article. They used this knowledge to write a newspaper article about when Pandora opened the box.

In Geography, the children were looking at the different capital cities within North America. They really enjoyed the multiple-choice quiz that we had, where they worked in teams, holding up the relevant coloured card to the relevant answers. They then went to on to choose 10 different capital cities within North America, identifying the population, the size of the city, and the number of languages spoken within the different cities.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have looked at ways we can add and subtract using efficient ways rather than always using a formal method to calculate. We also recapped our knowledge of long division.

In English, we have started our new book all about the life of Anne Frank. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning about her life before she moved to Amsterdam. We wrote sentences about her life using colons and semi-colons. We can't wait to show off our new skills in our longer pieces of writing.

In PSHE, we discussed the anti-bullying theme of 'Reach Out'. We discussed the importance of anti-bullying and what we should do if we are being bullied, we see bullying happen and if we are bullying. We create posters to display our knowledge.
