St Joseph, Pray for all our Fathers, Amen



YEAR R NEWS

We've had a super week in Reception! We have been enjoying the hot weather- we've been doing lots of water play to keep cool. It has linked perfectly with our book this week called, 'Commotion in the Ocean'. We have been writing about our favourite sea animals and have been discussing lots of new sea animals we have never heard of before.

In Maths, we have continued to develop our understanding of teen numbers. We loved playing a fun game of teen number bingo which ended up getting quite competitive! We will be moving on from this next week, however, it would be fantastic if you could keep working on recognising teen numbers and recalling number facts for them at home (e.g. 14 is one 10 and four ones).

In RE, we have been exploring the topic of 'The Church Family'. On Thursday, we went to visit church and were able to explore all around it. We took photos of things that were interesting to us, including the font and the altar. Father Lawrie even showed us the Baptismal record book and lots of us found our names in there from when we were baptised as babies.

YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in Maths, we have started learning about money. We have talked about: money vocabulary, identified the different values of coins and notes and practised adding amounts of money and writing them in pounds and pence. If you get the opportunity to use money with your child over the coming weeks this would be really beneficial.

In English, we have been writing poetry for our Father's Day cards. We thought about lots of abstract nouns and the ways in which we could compare our dads with these qualities.

In Science, we have begun to learn about the classification of different animals. We identified some of the features of the 5 mains classes. The five most well known classes of vertebrates (animals with backbones) are mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and amphibians. We know that humans are mammals and that insects, fish, amphibians and reptiles are all cold blooded.

In RE, we have been thinking about Jesus as a healer. A great portion of Christ's time was dedicated to healing the sick. He healed all kinds of people: this week we learnt about the miracle of the paralysed man. We reflected on how the paralysed man and his friends must have felt once Jesus had healed him.

In Topic, we have been learning about countries around the world and this week we have been learning about the capital city of France- Paris. We know some of the famous landmarks of Paris: the Eiffel Tower, Arc de Triomphe and the Notre Dame Cathedral. We drew the French flag and we tried some delicious French pastries.

YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we have been writing diary extracts. We read 'Vlad and the Great Fire of London' which is told by the viewpoint of a flea! We then decided to write our own extracts from the viewpoint of the bakery cat. We worked hard to describe how the cat felt when they realised the bakery was on fire. We used lots of excellent adjectives and adverbs to help set the scene!

In Maths, we have been doing lots of recapping. We have practised making amounts with money, finding fractions of shapes and numbers and have also looked at the properties of 2D and 3D shape. The class have remembered lots of skills taught this year and it is fabulous to see the progress they have made. Well done Year 2!

As part of our art topic about African Art, we started by looking at the varying landscapes in the continent Africa. We then discussed how these can be used to help us create our own patterns and designs.

In RE, we discussed who the early Christians were and how they lived. We realised that today, as Christians, we live very similar lives: we share meals, we pray, we share what we know about Jesus and we care for everyone. We asked the question "Would people know we are Christians by how we act and what we say to each other?" We decided "kind words, kind actions" was a great statement to live by.

YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we have started a new unit of writing about the adventures of Tadeo Jones. The children will be writing a 3rd person narrative and have started by exploring figurative language and expanded noun phrases to use in their opening setting description. The children worked really well to come up with some very exciting metaphors and similes to set the scene. They then explored the use of adverbial phrases to add more detail to a sentence before using a storyboard to plan their narratives.

In Science, we have started a new unit exploring forces and magnets. The children learnt that a force is a push or a pull that acts upon an object. They labelled different push and pull forces before annotating diagrams to show the direction of the force applied.

In RE, we revisited the parable of the Good Samaritan. The children enjoyed singing a song and playing a game to demonstrate their understanding of the characters in the parable and reflected on the virtues the Samaritan showed when helping the Jewish man.

YEAR 4 NEWS

On Thursday, Year 4 had a great day at St Mary's, Menston for a PE transition day. We started by playing handball on the Astroturf pitches. Then we practised our netball skills and it was lovely to see some past pupils from St Joseph's being sports leaders. After a break, we finished the morning by practising some football skills and then played some football matches. The children were rewarded for all of their hard work by having an ice lolly after their lunch. The children demonstrated some great skills but more importantly brilliant teamwork and behaviour.

In Maths this week, our new topic is statistics. This involves the children reading and interpreting different graphs including pictograms and bar charts.

In English, the children have started reading our new book, "Christophe's Story". We have looked at writing conversations and thought about character description for the main character.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths, we been looking at adding and subtracting decimals with the same number of decimal places. We used concrete equipment to help us understand the value of the numbers in the different columns. Next, we used the formal method of column addition to add decimals.

In Science, we carried out an investigation about levers and pullies as part of our force topic. We began by making prediction about what movement and force was acting on the ruler when objects were placed on top. They drew diagrams and recorded their results in a table and analysed those results to write their findings in their conclusion.

In History, we started our new topic 'Anglo-Saxons and Vikings' by looking at what life was like in the 4th Century during the end of the Roman Empire. We thought about how the Roman Emperor was losing control of the Empire and how people in Rome and Britannia started to rebel.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Science, we recapped the digestive system (which we learnt about in Y4) and wrote a story about a Mars bar's journey through the digestive system. We really enjoyed using our knowledge of grammar and punctuation

In Art, we started our new topic of expressing ourselves, where we are worked on sketching expressions on faces. We did this in small steps focusing mainly on the eyes, nose and mouth.

Throughout the week, we have been in full rehearsal mode for our end of year production with lots of singing and acting. The list of costumes will be sent out early next week.

In Music, we are continuing to work towards our Orange Award from Artforms for using a ukulele. We practised different chords to pieces of music.


