OTLEY SCIENCE FESTIVAL

On Wednesday, KS1 enjoyed 'Amazing Air' by Dr Sarah Bearchell at Otley Courthouse. The show focused on how do we know if air is there if we cannot see it? The children were then shown how even though we can not see it, we can see and feel the effects of air. The lady used an air canon to hit paper cups around the room off the ledges and used a fan to move bubbles around the room which the children loved.

ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

On Monday, we celebrated Odd Socks Day and all wore odd socks to express ourselves and celebrate what makes us all unique! Mrs Dowd-Postlethwaite led an assembly to introduce Anti-Bullying week and to remind children what to do if they see another child being unkind.

Throughout the week, we have reflected on the theme 'Make a Noise About Bullying' and to remind everyone whether it's in school, at home, in the community or online, to speak out by telling a trusted adult so that that they can try and help resolve the problem. We looked at what is the difference between 'banter' and bullying. Some classes created a bant-o-meter where they described or drew pictures at each interval to show whether it was jokey banter or genuinely unkind bullying.

This week, we continued to look at our virtue of hope. We thought about how November is an important month for the Church as it is a time when we remember those who have gone before us. YEAR 5 MASS

The theme of the Mass was 'Creation' which was our RE topic last term. We thought about how God wants us to be stewards of the Earth. We thanked God for our beautiful world and all the people in it. The children read and sang beautifully and Miss Grant was very impressed.

The children all behaved beautifully and did their parts with confidence - well done Year 5! Thank you to Father Nicholas for leading our worship for us.

CLASS PAGES

YEAR R NEWS

This week, the children had a lovely week exploring all the nursery rhymes around the room.

In our Drawing Club, we have been making yummy porridge and of course, eating it! We then wrote instructions about how to make it. At home, ask your child to show you how to make porridge and try other flavours.

In Maths, we have looked at shapes and focusing on circles and triangles, and identified their properties. We have also been learning about recognising 4 and 5 and hunting for them in the outside provision.

In RE, we have been learning about Diwali and we made some beautiful clay pots.

As it is Anti-Bullying week, we have focused on being kind and how we can show kindness to others. We created a kindness tree to remind us to always show kindness to everyone.

YEAR 1 NEWS

In English, we finished reading 'Peepo' and started gathering ideas for what we could write about in our own book based on what we can see in our classroom. To help us do this, the children found out how we can make plurals by adding -s to the end of words.

We have continued looking at addition in Maths and number bonds within ten. The children have been using counters and ten frames to help them find different number bonds within ten.

In Geography, we thought about what sort of place Otley was and whether it was a city, town or village. We thought about some of the features in Otley such as the river, the Chevin and that it has lots of houses in it but also fields around it. On Tuesday next week (21.11.23), we are hoping to go for a walk around Otley to look at some of the different features and to compare the different types of housing in Otley. Please ensure your child has a coat and suitable footwear with them on this day - thank you.

As part of Anti-Bullying Week, Year 1 have thought about what kindness means and different kind words that we can use. The children enjoyed making cards and kindness bands.

YEAR 2 NEWS

In Maths, we have continued to work hard with adding 2-digit numbers to a 1-digit number. We are getting very good at making groups of ten ones and exchanging them for one ten. We used base ten to help us with this and began to practise recording it in our books.

In English, we have continued to enjoy the story 'Winter's Child'. We are using some exciting and interesting vocabulary to describe the beautiful setting. We have also been learning about how to write captions for pictures. We needed to use capital letters, full stops and make sure it was written in the past tense.

As part of our RE work this week, we have been learning about the Holy Trinity. We discussed how one person can be a sister, a daughter and a niece, just as God can be three in one: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We also enjoyed learning the Glory be prayer.

We all enjoyed wearing our odd socks on Monday to start Anti-Bullying Week. We have given lots of thought about who we can reach out to if we feel we are being bullied and what to do if we see someone being bullied. We designed our own odd socks and wrote positive words on them.

YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, the children practised their acting skills by role playing as townspeople from Hamelin. They wrote about their thoughts and feelings seeing a rat, and drew upon these ideas to create a descriptive paragraph.

In Maths, we looked at subtraction bridging 10 and 100. We used related calculations to solve problems efficiently and systematically. We then learnt the formal methods of column addition and subtraction. We also practised our Mental Arithmetic - the children are becoming much more fluent with their number facts. Well done Year 3!

In RE, we began learning about The Annunciation. We discussed what it feels like to be chosen for something special before reading the story of when Angel Gabriel visited Mary. We discussed her thoughts and feelings before writing an email in role as Mary to Joseph telling him all about what happened!

We came to the end of our History topic and began Geography this week. We will be looking at the physical and human geography of Otley, and looking at maps to develop our knowledge of directions and the local area.

In PSHE, we looked at an anti-bullying poem called 'Bully', as well as two children who had experiences of bullying in their school. Year 3 confidently explained how important it is to tell a trusted adult about what is going on, and created posters to encourage other children to do this.

YEAR 4 NEWS

Year 4 started the week making an interesting discovery in our reading corner! After break on Monday, we came in to find a robotic arm cordoned off with police tape. Using this as inspiration for our writing, the children wrote a series of factual formal sentences using modal verbs to form part of a newspaper report on the finding.

In Maths, we started our unit on multiplication by looking at multiples of 3. Year 4 explored how to recognise if a number is a multiple of 3 by finding its digit sum.

In RE, the children learnt the story of Zechariah and Elizabeth. They learnt that it can be hard to trust God but through prayer and faith you can.

In Geography, the children used atlases to label different European countries and identify their features.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In English, we have been focusing on writing expanded, detailed sentences based on a setting from 'The Lost Thing'. The children used thesauruses to find synonyms for emotive adjectives as well use a variety of adverbs and subordinate clauses to add detail and dimension to their sentences.

In Maths, we have been furthering our understanding of squared and cubed numbers. We have used a plethora of concrete resources such as counters and multi-link squares to visibly make those connections of what is a squared number and what is a cubed number. From this, the children applied these concrete models to their learning.

In PSHE, as part of the National Anti-Bullying Week 2023, we spent time looking at the difference between what is 'banter' and what is 'bullying'. The children were able to recognise the difference between the two and created a wonderful poem on why we shouldn't bully.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been recapping our knowledge of equivalent fractions and simplifying them; we used the Cuisenaire rods to help us. We moved on to placing fractions on a number line ensuring that we look at the start points and the end points.

In English, we wrote a Remembrance poem with figurative language in it. We were able to choose what style of poem we wrote - a noun poem, Fibonacci, free verse, rhyming or 2-worder poem. Additionally, we started our new book all about Anne Frank's life and her diary. We really enjoyed learning about who she was and her life in the annex.

During our RE lesson, we began our new topic of 'Justice'. We discussed what justice and injustice is. We read a poem about refugees and identified where it made reference to injustices in the poem. After this, we thought about which images showed justice and created a piece of artwork.


