

CONFIRMATION

On Wednesday and Thursday next week, 17 candidates will receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit when they are Confirmed in church. Please keep these children in your prayers.



A text message has been sent to the parents of all candidates confirming which day their child is receiving the Sacrament (everyone has been allocated the day they chose). At the Mass, each family will be allocated a bench.

COVID RESTRICTIONS THAT WILL BE IN PLACE:

Only two households (bubbles) will be able to sit on the bench together.

Masks will need to be worn unless exempt.

On entering Church, contact details will need to be taken for track and trace.

Hands will need to be sanitised when entering Church.

There will be no singing.

We will not kneel in Church.

After Communion, you do not say "Amen". Instead this will be said together beforehand.

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

In our Collective Worship on Monday, the children listened to the parable that Jesus told about the mustard seed comparing it to the Kingdom of Heaven. We talked about the meaning of this parable and that perhaps Jesus was trying to teach us that the Kingdom of heaven is also always growing, just like the seed, so that there's room for everyone who wants to be there. Jesus might also have been showing us how size doesn't matter — even the tiniest seed can produce a great big tree. The same is true for us — even the smallest person can do great things. And even the smallest action can have big results. The children in Key Stage Two were given a mustard seed to take away with them.

Our Statement of the week this week has been:

I know what human dignity means and I show that I respect others.

In our Collective Worship, the children thought about what human dignity means and how important it is to show respect for everyone – no matter who they are. We believe that everyone is a child of God and we were all made by God to be like God. Because of this and because God's life is within each one of us we have to treat other people the same way we would treat Jesus.







CLASS NEWS



YEAR R NEWS

We have started our new topic People Who Help Us. To begin our topic, the children were asked to write about what they would like to be when they grow up, we had some lovely suggestions including doctors, vets, builders and racing car drivers! As part of our topic lessons, we have been learning about the role of the Police Officer, the children have really enjoyed playing in our new Police Station role-play area!

In Maths this week, we have been learning about odd and even numbers. We have done lots of practical activities that have allowed the children to visualise this such as people getting on and off of the bus (made of chairs) and adding the correct

numicon to 'Odd Todd' and 'Even Steven' and explaining their reasons why.



We also had a very exciting visit to Church on Wednesday and got to meet Father Lawrie! The children got to have a look round Church and ask Father Lawrie some questions. They were able to link what they had learnt in RE to their time in Church and spotted the Sanctuary Light, Tabernacle and stained glass windows. They learnt lots and are very excited to go back again.



YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in RE we have been thinking about why Jewish people celebrate Passover. We listened to the story of how Moses led God's people to freedom by parting The Red Sea. When the Pharaoh reneged (once again) on his promise and chased them, God closed the sea and the Egyptians were drowned.

In Maths this week, we have started a new unit and have been learning about position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns. We practised moving in quarter turns to help with our understanding.



In English, we have been writing a recount of what Stanley did with his stick when writing a postcard to his friend Bertie. We focused on using regular verbs in the simple past tense (ed).

We have started a new unit in PE on tennis and this week we practised our forehand grip whilst bouncing the ball on the ground. We then gently bounced the ball on our racket up and down and moved side to side whilst bouncing the ball. We also competed in teams doing ball balancing exercises whilst walking up and down the playground.

We ended our week with a cricket skills session and enjoyed lots of practice of running between wickets, fielding and batting balls. We enjoyed making some pictures of landscapes in Art using a combination of felt tip pens and watercolours.

YEAR 2 NEWS

Year 2 have been hard at work completing their final assessments for the year. They have tackled each assessment with a mature attitude and shown great resilience throughout the week. Mrs Deyes and I are extremely proud of each member of year 2 and want to give a big well done to you all!

In RE this week, we have been putting our senses to the test, we all closed our eyes and pretended we were an Apostle in the room waiting for the Holy Spirit to come. The children have all written some lovely sense poems detailing what we could touch, smell, taste, hear and see. We also learnt about the fruits of the Holy Spirit and why it is important that we live out the fruits.

We also had a special guest zoom our class this week as we started our learning on Sikhism. The children really enjoyed listening to Manni talk about and show them the 5 Ks. They had lots of questions to ask, and they were all very excited learning about a different faith.

YEAR 3 NEWS

Well done to all of the Year 3 children for working so hard this week! As well as our end of year assessments, we have also had our Year 3 Class Mass - thank you to all of the families who were able to attend.

As part of our English assessments we have had a Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Reading paper to complete this week. We have also created a pros and cons display on our English working wall to decide whether to read our class text, 'How to Live Forever'.

In Maths we completed an Arithmetic and a Reasoning paper. We have also been continuing with our topic of time, and measuring and comparing duration in hours and minutes.

In Geography we have looked at products that are exported from Brazil, and how our lives are linked to Brazil by what we use. It was interesting to find out that we get a lot of rubber from Brazil!

On Thursday we went to church to lead our Mass on thanksgiving for our families. Well done to all the children who read beautifully and behaved so reverently in church.



YEAR 4 NEWS

Yet again, Mrs Holmes is extremely proud of Year 4! They have worked immensely hard during assessment week and have all tried their very best.

As part of our Maths work, we have started a new topic. We have been learning about statistics. The children have been looking at different ways to present data and how to find comparisons by finding the sum and difference between data.

In English we have been practising using apostrophes for contractions. The Queen visited us and spoke in a 'posh' standard English voice, but as soon as she took her crown off, she started to use the contracted forms of words. We completed a puzzle by matching the standard forms with the contracted form.

In Science, the children have really enjoyed continuing our electricity topic. We investigated different types of electrical circuit to see which ones lit up a light bulb.



YEAR 5 NEWS

In RE, we have started to look at our World Faith which is Hinduism. This week, we have learnt Hindus believe in one supreme God called Brahman who is represented in three different forms known as Trimurti. The Trimurti consists of: Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva.

In Maths, we have been learning about multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000. We talked about how we move the digits to the left or the right on the place value chart. We applied this knowledge to convert different types of measurements.

We have continued to read the story "Clockwork" in English and have used dictionaries to find the meaning of unfamiliar words as well as writing a precis for part of the story.

In PE, we have started playing tennis - ready for Wimbledon!!! This week, we practised our forehands by hitting the ball over the net to our partners.

In DT, we have continued to make our bags. So far, we have cut out the made our pattern pieces, cut out the fabric and added decorations to the front of the fabric.



YEAR 6 NEWS

In English, we have learnt about the skills used to be a journalist. Our hook was The Guardian clip about the Three Little Pigs. We identified feature to be included in journalistic writing and used these to write our orientation.

In Maths, we investigated angles in a triangle. We discussed the different types of triangles and explored how this can help us when working out the angles in the interior of a triangle and the exterior.

Our play rehearsals are in full swing now. Well done to the children who are really beginning to develop their character and give them a personality.

We celebrated our first Class Mass of the year with some parents and Father Lawrie. Our theme was 'Thanksgiving' for the years we have been at St Joseph's. We reflected with some beautiful readings. Thank you to all the parents who attended.
