Hi everyone,

Thank you for a great week in school – there has been lots of hard work. The children have chosen the work for the displays in the corridor. I know Y2 and Y5 have chosen some artwork and Y6 have been working on some letters of complaint. I can't wait to have look next week.

Reading at home

I am currently liaising with the class teachers looking at reading at home. I would like to stress the importance of reading regularly at home with your child.

EYFS and Key Stage 1: If your child is in Reception or KS1, they should be reading most nights. It is important to set aside a quiet time to read with your child. Being able to read is crucial to your child's success at school and in life, and the younger a child learns to read, the more enjoyment and confidence they will have in all subjects. Though we listen to individual readers in school, we need parents/carers to support this. Unfortunately, there a small number of children in each group who are not reading regularly at home. If you need support with helping your child read at home, you can contact your child's class teacher or myself to discuss.

Key stage 2: All year groups should be reading for 15 mins most nights. Again, set a time for reading and try and keep to it it pays off.

There is nothing more wonderful than immersing yourself in a brilliant book.


Around school, you'll find posters and tip cards packed with ideas on how to start your conversation. There is also information about how to support others, and where to go if you need support.

PRAYER OF THE WEEK


Our prayer of the week, this week has been the Act of Faith.

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

On Wednesday this week, some of our classes were able to join a Collective Worship led by children from SS Peter & Paul's School which was also joined by children from Holy Name. In Year 5, the theme was linked to our virtue - faith and the children listened to the story of Jesus healing the paralysed man. After listening to the story, the children had some time to reflect on the key aspects of the story. Our children will be leading a Collective Worship for SS Peter & Paul's on a few weeks' time.

Our statement of the week was: I listen to what you say and I show that I am listening. We talked about why it is important that we listen to one another and how we show that we are listening. We listened to a reading from the First Book of Samuel where Samuel says to God, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening."

Our virtue at the start of this term has been faith. During the past few weeks, the children have reflected on what it means to have faith and how we can show our faith. This week, we listened to the story of the disciples showing faith in Luke's Gospel. They did what Jesus said because they had faith in him and knew that Jesus would help them. Next week, our virtue will be Simplicity.




YEAR R NEWS

In Literacy, we have been reading the story 'Aliens Wear Underpants'. We made our own aliens and then wrote a description. Jude's alien was called Bob. He said, "It has a green face and four eyes."

In Maths, we have been learning about Weight and Capacity. We used the balance scales to compare the weight of different classroom objects. We learnt that although an object may be big it does not mean it's always heavier.

In RE, we have been continuing our topic 'Getting to Know Jesus'. We thought about how we can show our love for people that are poorly. We had some super ideas such as making cards, drawing pictures, and saying prayers.



YEAR 1 NEWS

We have been learning about Baptism in RE. We enjoyed sharing some of the symbolic items we wore or were given at our own baptism (thanks to parents for these, they were wonderful). We reflected on why Catholics and other Christians are baptised (to welcome them into God's family and to show that they belong to Christ).



We have been investigating the trees on our school grounds in Science. We have been observing the birch tree whilst in Y1 and watching how it changes throughout the seasons. We labelled the parts of a tree.

This week in Maths, we have been learning about mass and weight. We have learnt that when each side of a balance scale is the same height, the mass on each side is equal. When one end is tipped lower the mass of that object is heavier and vice versa. We practised placing objects on the balance scale to see which objects were heavier or lighter.

In English, we have been writing a retelling of the story in Aladdin. We used lots of actions to help us memorise each part. We've really been focussing on our cursive handwriting this week.

On Wednesday we had a DT afternoon so that we could finish the project we have been working on for the past few weeks. We have been making a moving story of Humpty Dumpty, we are looking forward to bringing our projects home. They look fantastic!

YEAR 2 NEWS

This week in English, we have been thinking about improving adjectives. First of all we took 4 words which were synonyms for the word scared. We then discussed how we can order then thinking about their intensity. After that we took a word wheel and placed 4 different adjectives in the middle. We then used Thesauruses to help up improve each of the words. Finally, we used some of the words in sentences. Some people even included conjunctions to join their sentences!

In Maths, we have been continuing our work on money. We have been finding the difference by using different methods such as using a number-line to count on and back. We thought about how this could help us when working out the correct change. Finally, we put our skills and knowledge to the test by solving two-step problems.

As part of our RE work about 'The Good News', we learnt about how Jesus healed the ten lepers. We learnt that Jesus asked the lepers to go and see the priest and when they set off, they were healed. We also found out that only one of the lepers returned to say thank you to Jesus. We looked at an artist's impression of what this scene may have looked like and discussed what each person may have been thinking.

In Science, we have started to look at what makes a healthy diet. We began by looking at the different food groups and sorted lots of different foods into these groups. We then created a tally of our favourite foods and were surprised to find that the favourite food group was fats/sugars.

YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we have been finishing our imagery poems. The children have also talked about the themes in the Tear Thief story and discussed descriptive words and phrases that capture the reader's interest and imagination.

In Maths, we have been revisiting the x2, x4 and x8 tables. We have played lots of games and undertaken investigations.

In Science, we have started our new topic on Animals including humans and started to look closely at different types of food and food groups. We also checked on our mini-composters and put some soil samples in water for further investigations.

This week in RE, we have listened to the story of the parable of The Lost Sheep. We have thought about what this parable teaches us about God's forgiveness.

In PE, we have started our Gymnastics topic. This week, we have been learning techniques for landing safely.



YEAR 4 NEWS

In English, we have been exploring the language of 'Cinnamon'. Our work has included comparing and contrasting the different characters by inferring their thoughts and emotions, and creating poems using similes to describe how the tiger feeds, hunts and sleeps.

In Maths, we have been focusing on 2-digit and 3-digit multiplication with a 1-digit number. We have focused on finding and using the most efficient method for a multiplication based on our personal preference. If children have trouble with the written method, then partitioning the number is another method they could use.

In RE, we have started to look at the Order of Mass. We reflected on what we experience when we go to Mass, and the children had an excellent understanding of the different parts of the Mass. They created posters to explain the Order of Mass up to the Liturgy of the World.

In Science, we looked at the function of our teeth and how to care for them. We learned and used the vocabulary of incisors, canines and molars and performed actions for their different functions. We then performed an experiment to test how different substances might affect our teeth - we will record the results next week.

YEAR 5 NEWS

Year 5 have continued to look at poetry this week and have been trying to use figurative language (similes, metaphors, personification) to write our own poems based on a short video we watched called, "The Ridge".

In Maths, we have started our work on multiplication and division. This week, we have focused on multiplication and have looked at written methods for multiplying 4-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers and multiplying 2-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers.



In Science, the children enjoyed investigating what happened to different solids when mixed with water. We looked at coffee granules, marbles, flour, gravy granules, salt and sugar. Afterwards, the children wrote conclusions trying to use the word: dissolve, soluble and insoluble.

Following on from looking at the world's tallest mountains in Geography last week, this week we looked at the tallest mountains in the different countries in Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been multiplying and dividing fractions with a integer. We've used Numicon and drawn bar model to represent our working out. It seemed really hard at first but now it's so easy for us!

In English, we planned and wrote a letter of compliant to Mr Beardsley about the poor technology we have in school. In the letter, we included various language and grammar/punctuation features that we could include, such as: passive voice, subjunctive form relative clause, colons and semi colons and dashed. We are going to edit, redraft and publish these letter next week.



In Science, we looked at harmful and non-harmful micro-organisms. We discovered that these can come in the form of bacteria, a virus or fungus. We wanted to investigate fungus (mould) further so in groups we thought of different areas of the classroom were it might have the most micro-organism – door handles, chair, window and hands. We rubbed bread on and now have placed them in a cupboard, fridge, window and radiator to see where the most mould will grow.


