This is open to all the children in the school, their grownups and staff. We will publish updates during the year and will purchase a trophy for the winner and runner up. All the rules and guide as to how to play are on the fantasy league website but basically before the Premier League season starts those wishing to join the league, need to choose 15 players costing £100 million or less from the list of players. Then each week you can make substitutions and a transfer. There are also "chips" you can play during the season.

The advantage of playing is that it will teach the children the value of money eg they won't have enough money to buy Haaland, Kane, Saka, Rashford and Salah! It will also help them with their Maths (reading decimal numbers, negative numbers and adding). However it can be frustrating when teams lose or players are injured, and it can cause panic on a Saturday morning when you realise you haven't updated your team and there are only 10 minutes left before the deadline!!!! 
