Parking - please do not park or use the road outside of school to drop children off. Use designated carparks.



# **CLASS NEWS**

## YEAR R NEWS

Reception have come back to school full of news about their Easter break and we have enjoyed sharing it on Tapestry. We have also been writing about what we did in the holidays. We have also listened to the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and been writing characters descriptions of the giant.



In Maths we have been learning to recognise numbers between 11 and 20. Please support your child to ensure they are secure with these numbers.

In RE we have started our new topic called 'New Life' and heard how the angel appeared to Mary to tell her Jesus was alive. We thought about how that made her feel happy and what makes us feel happy.

This week we have done some gardening and planted a broad bean seed. We talked about what our seed needs to grow; we have watered it and left outside to hopefully grow in the sunshine. We had a very special delivery on Tuesday which we are all very excited about. We received 18 hen eggs which we have put in our incubator and hopefully in three weeks they will hatch into chicks.



### YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in Maths, we have been learning how to count objects in pairs and to count forwards and backwards in 2s. We have used ten frames, 1-50 grid and number tracks to help with our understanding of this.

When we arrived back to class after break on Thursday, we were somewhat dismayed to find that our red, London bus known as 'Naughty Bus' had run amok and tipped over pen-pots and knocked over chairs! We wrote a letter to him, telling him how disappointed we were in his behaviour and asked him not to do that again!

In RE this week, we have been thinking about the importance of Mary Magdalene's role within the Easter story. Having already witnessed Jesus' death on the cross, she was then present at the tomb. Mary was the first person to whom Jesus appeared after his resurrection and the first to preach the "Good News" of that miracle. We reflected on her feelings of confusion, bewilderment and then joy.

In PE, Mrs Fenton-Green has been helping us to develop our throwing and catching skills. We started by throwing (body- buffers) to our partner from the sitting position, then we progressed to our knees and then standing. We practised moving around and getting into position quickly to throw and catch to one another.

# YEAR 2 NEWS

In English this week, we have continued our work using 'Flotsam', our class text. We have been developing and editing our writing to build on our descriptions of the wonderful pictures in the book. Everyone is enjoying thinking of exciting vocabulary to build up an image in the reader's mind.



In Maths, we have been learning about unit and non-unit fractions. We know that unit fractions have a numerator of 1 so we are focussing on just one of the parts. A non-unit fraction has a numerator of more than one. We all enjoyed finding non -unit fractions of groups of donuts!

As part of our RE work about The Mass, we focused on the most important part of service - the Consecration. We made links to the Last Supper and discussed how the priest uses the same words as Jesus did at the Last Supper. We found out that when the priest says these words, Jesus becomes truly present at the altar. On Friday, we celebrated St George's Day!

As part of our computing work about media music, we used looked at how we can create different rhythms and pulses. We practised first using clapping and clicking before creating our own rhythms on Chrome Music Lab. We all enjoyed sharing our rhythmic creations!

### YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, Year 3 finished reading The Pied Piper of Hamelin. We had an in depth discussion, sharing our opinions and backing them up with evidence. We then did a 'role on the wall' for the character of The Pied Piper; we found facts that the book tells us about him, and also gave our opinions on his character.



In Maths, we started our unit of measuring length. We started the week by measuring different lengths in mm, cm and m before moving on to learning about equivalent lengths.

In Geography, we carried out some research on North America. We located the different countries in North America, labelling them and their capital cities on a map, and created a 'Top 8' fact file, listing the highest peak, largest lake etc.

In Computing, we started our unit on programming. In our first lesson, we got to grips with the basics of Scratch.

### YEAR 4 NEWS

In English, we have started to analyse our new class text 'The Selfish Giant' by Oscar Wilde. The children have created setting descriptions of the garden filled with expanded noun phrases, as well as using their inference skills to describe the giant's personality and write him a letter explaining how his actions are affecting other people.

In Maths, we have continued our work on decimals. The children have worked on dividing a 1-digit and 2-digit number by 10, using the decimal place value chart to help them. They have also converted tenths and hundredths into fractions and decimals. So many children are now accessing the tricky extra challenges in Maths lessons - well done for your hard work!

In RE, the children worked in groups to plan their own Collective Worships, which they will lead every Thursday for the next 10 weeks. They chose their own Bible readings to fit their theme and thought about how to help the class reflect on the Word. Finally, they created PowerPoint Presentations for their worships.

In Science, we looked at habitats around school to launch our new topic of Living Things and Their Habitats. We thought about what habitats needed to provide for animals and other living things, then the children explored the school grounds for different varieties of habitat.



# YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths this week, we have started to look at decimals which the children have done really well with. We have compared numbers with decimals as well as converted them to fractions.

This week in English, we read "When the Giant Stirred" and summarised the story in our words. We also revised some of our grammar terminology.

On Tuesday afternoon, we had fun in Science investigating friction by pushing toy cars down ramps onto different surfaces to see which surface caused the most friction.

Our focus in Art this half term is, "Every Picture Tells a Story". This week, we looked at a piece of art by Banksy and the children tried to change it to reflect the British value of mutual respect.



## YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we began our topic of ratio. Firstly, we talked about what ratio is and soon moved on to calculating it - it's not as tricky as we thought. Later on the week, we looked at scale factors and how to calculate them.

In RE, we looked at the events of Holy Week and how we celebrate these events in Church. We discussed the importance of these events and how they link to Catholic's beliefs.

In Music, we listened to music from Hans Zimmer. Using various instruments, we tried to create our own shimmer effect to go alongside a piece of his music.

In French, we played a game to recap the different countries in Europe. We focused on our pronunciation of these countries and even had a go at saying sentences with the countries in.


