A MESSAGE FROM MISS CHOMA

Hi everyone,

Well done to all the children who have worked hard and done some amazing work this week. YR were learning the sound 's' (with some super actions) and related words. Walter made an amazing Lego model of a mobile home. Y1 have been learning one more. I was impressed at how fast Scarlett could subitise and work out one more. They were also writing about the first teddy bear - I wish I owned one! Y2 were using sound buttons to break words into the different sounds they hear. In maths they were using the symbols <, =, > in number sentences. Y3 were writing letters to thank some monkeys who helped their families. They were very thought provoking. Y4 had a great time swimming. They were listening to their class novel – The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe. They were able to explain the word fraternise that they had learned from yesterday. Y5 were learning about The Mayans and their culture. They learnt that the Mayans developed the area we know as Central America. Y6 were learning the French words for different sports and composing sentences on whether they liked or disliked a sport. Their accents were **très bon!** They are also learning about WW1 to 1933 – I was very impressed with their recall and understanding of key facts. Well done Bede who could explain hyperinflation and that Germans had carry money around in a suitcase!

I was very pleased with the learning behaviour in all the classes. The children were attentive, listening carefully and answering some very trick questions.



CLASS NEWS



YEAR R NEWS

This week, Reception started learning phonics. We have learnt four new letter sounds including s,a,t and p. We thought carefully about objects that begin with the sound being taught. We also practised writing each sound in different media. On Thursday, the children took home their sound books for them to practise the sounds over the weekend.

This week we started RE. We thought about how God loves and cares for each of us. We thought carefully about people we love and people who love us. Lucas said "My Mummy loves me to the moon and back."

On Thursday, we had a very exciting morning as not only did we do PE but we also met our Y6 Buddies! The children loved meeting their special friend and had time to play with them outside on the field. There was lots of smiles and laughter!

On Friday, the children also had the opportunity to enjoy a yummy cake with their buddy as part of our Macmillan Coffee Morning.



YEAR 1 NEWS

In Maths, we have been investigating 3D shapes. We sorted the shapes into different groups based on whether they would roll and or stack. We also carried out some number investigations which involved discussing odd and even, halving and one more/less.

In Topic for our unit on Toys, we thought about some well-known toys from the past and the year that they were introduced. Did you know the Teddy bear is said to be named after United States President Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt. We placed the toys on a timeline dating back to the early 1900s. We completed a sorting activity of old and new toys.

In Science this week, we have been learning about the months of the year and which months go with the seasons. We have learnt that each season is 3 months long and what happens to the weather as we move into each new season.

This week In English, we have been writing letters to our favourite Superhero asking them to come and help save the planet from the dastardly duo known as Filth and Vacuum. We have tried to appeal to their better natures by using lots of interesting adjectives to describe how wonderful they are.

This weekend Otley will be hosting a three-day festival celebrating: kindness to self, kindness to others and kindness to the planet. With this in mind we have been thinking about kindness this week and the little things we can do to show kindness to our classmates



YEAR 2 NEWS

In our English work this week, we have been focusing on nouns and adjectives. We practised sorting nouns into group and then spotting nouns in sentences. We then discussed how we can use adjectives to describe a noun. We used adjectives to describe the characters from our text 'A Squash and a Squeeze'. We came up with some fabulous ideas.

In Maths, we have been practising using place-value charts to record numbers. We had to think carefully about where the tens and ones needed to be. We then used the symbols < > and = to compare objects and numbers.

As part of our topic work about explorers, we looked at an old picture of a group of explorers in the South Pole. We thought about what we could see in the photograph. We discussed with our partners about what we thought was happening in the picture and then came up with some questions we would like to ask to find out more.

In Art, we were introduced to a new technique called Frottage. Frottage is creating pictures using rubbings. We took rubbings of lots of different surfaces and objects such as the playground and leaves. We then used tearing and cutting to create our own mystical creatures.



YEAR 3 NEWS

This week in our Collective Worship we reflected on 'I can say how I feel'. The worship was led by the children and in the readings, we heard about how sad Jesus felt when he heard that his friend Lazarus had died. We had a quiet time to reflect and discuss our own feelings.

In Science we learnt that granite is an igneous rock and comes from the Earth's crust. We found out that granite has a high density because it sinks, and it is durable because we couldn't grind it down with sandpaper. Also, it does not allow water to pass through it - that is called impermeable. We have learnt a lot of new vocabulary to start learning in our Science Rocks and Soils topic!

In English, Year 3 continued our journey to become royal tea tasters. We wrote a set of instructions on how to taste tea correctly, discussing different verbs we could use. We also learnt how to write an informal letter, writing in role of a character from the story.

YEAR 4 NEWS

This week's swimming was fantastic! We are also getting much quicker at changing - please double check your child has everything they need in their bag. It would also be helpful for children with earrings to take them out for Fridays if possible.

The children had their first Big Write this week in English, creating newspaper reports about the Iron Man's appearance. We concentrated on inverted commas for speech, expanded noun phrases for imagery, and writing in a formal tone, which resulted in some fantastic pieces.



In Maths, we have been consolidating our knowledge of 4-digit numbers, and comparing their value. We used the method of exchanging to find 1, 10, and 100 less than certain numbers.

In Science, we conducted two investigations into gases, weighing fizzy drinks to determine whether gases have mass, and creating a chemical reaction between a liquid and a solid that resulted in a gas.

In History, we created our own enquiry questions about Roman Britain, and discussed what kind of evidence we need to answer these questions. The children then made timelines using a variety of unknown artefacts, discussing their reasoning.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In English this week, the children enjoyed writing their own stories about their mysterious lost creatures based on the book we have been reading "The Lost Thing".

In Maths, we have been learning about negative numbers and re-arranged the Premier League Table according to the goal difference of each team. Unfortunately, neither Leeds or Tottenham did any better using this method!!!

On Thursday afternoon, the children enjoyed taking part in a planet scavenger hunt with Mrs Russell. The children had to answer questions about the different planets by finding the answers that were hidden around outside.

In ICT, we have been looking at all the different digital systems that are used in our everyday lives and all the steps that happen to make them effective. This week, we looked at traffic lights with sensors and ordering products online.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In English, we recapped how to use subordinating clauses, including the use of the correct punctuation. We manipulated a range of subordinating clauses to vary our sentence starters.

In Maths, we looked at the formal methods for addition and subtraction, and how to use the inverse operation to check our answers.

Our first lesson of Leader in Me allowed us to discuss how we are all given the chance to become great leaders for ourselves and for others. In groups, we created posters and came up with a short piece of drama to show this.

In History, we looked at Hitler's rise to power from the end of WW1 to 1933. We discussed the significance of the events which led to his election as Chancellor. We created our own non-fiction pages to showcase what we had learnt.
