# **CLASS NEWS**



## YEAR R NEWS

This week in Reception, we have continued learning about the role of the police officer. The children have enjoyed acting out the role and writing about the important job that the police do. They thought about questions that they would like to ask a police officer if they had the chance such as, "How fast does your police car go?" and "How many times have you used your handcuffs?"

In Maths this week, we have been learning about halving. The children have explored this using various resources, on Friday we also had a go at having real objects such as an orange, a tomato and some chocolate. It would be great if you could practise this at home by sharing objects into two equal groups or even letting them help cut things in half.

As part of Faith Week, we have been learning about Hinduism in RE. We have been looking at where Hindu's worship and how the Mandirs differ from our church. The children enjoyed learning about how Hindu's pray, they had a go at saying "Namaste" and putting their forehead on the carpet as a sign of respect.

In Music this week, the children have been learning some new songs and adding in actions with Mrs Shakespeare.



#### YEAR 1 NEWS

In Music this term, Y1 have done really well to learn and remember all the actions to the following songs: Jump Jim Joe, Double This- Double That, In and Out The Shady Bluebells and Ding-Dong I've got the Rhythm In my Head.

In English, we have been reading the book Michael Recycle. Y1 are so knowledgeable about the different ways we can do this and love to share their ideas. We have also been practising our spelling and finding creative ways to help us spell those words that we sometimes struggle with.



In Maths, we have been looking at Capacity word problems and investigating how many cups it would take to fill a larger a jug or a bucket. We were able to practise this in the courtyard and managed to stay relatively dry!

To finish our unit on Judaism we have been learning about The Ten Commandments. Once Moses had led his people to freedom, God gave Moses a list of rules about the best way to live. We have been reflecting about the importance of rules and whilst they may not be easy to keep, they are a good way to help us live in peace and harmony.

On Thursday KS1 had their first Mass of the year in church. Mrs Harvey praised Y1 for their beautiful singing, readings and fantastic behaviour throughout the mass.

### YEAR 2 NEWS

This week in Maths we have started our unit on time. The children have been learning which hand is which, and how we know that the time is o'clock and half past.

This week Year 2 have been super active! On Wednesday, the children were super lucky and had two lessons taught by Mrs Fenton Green from PHGS. She got them ready for Sports Day by practising their races and then they had a rugby lesson in the afternoon practising their agility skills.

Year 2 also took part in their KS1 Mass this week. It was so lovely to be back in church together with Year 1 and parents. The children all did so well to sit still and listen to each other and Father Lawrie's words. They were also like a choir of angels and sung the hymns so well. A big well done from Mrs Deyes and me!

As part of our Sikhism unit, we spent Thursday afternoon getting creative and made some of the 5 K's. The children have made some beautiful Kirpans, Kangas and Karas to display in our classroom.




#### YEAR 3 NEWS

We have visited a number of local churches this week as part of our RE work on other faiths. In Year 3 we have been looking at other Christian denominations, so we went to visit Otley Methodist Church, Beech Hill Church, The Bridge Church, and of course Our Lady and All Saints in order to understand some of the similarities and differences between them. The children were complimented on how engaged they were in the discussion and for the fantastic questions they asked.



In English we have been looking at the suffixes -ation and -ous, and how they change the root word. It gave us an opportunity to revisit our spelling rules for suffixes, as well as adding interesting words like 'publication' and 'vigorous' to our vocabulary.





## YEAR 4 NEWS

We have now completed the Multiplication Tables Check. Mrs Holmes was proud of all the children. They all worked hard to complete as many questions as they could, and some children even enjoyed it!

This week, Year 4 have enjoyed learning about the Jewish faith as part of our World Faith Week. We focused on the Jewish celebration of Shabbat which happens every week starting on Friday evening and ends on Saturday evening. We learnt about lots of the different customs used during this special time. We then created some wonderful information pages.

In English, we have continued to practise using apostrophes for omission and possession. We are getting very good at using our Standard English voices to help us to remember the long form of contracted words.

As Sports Day was cancelled, we took part in a sports quiz with Year 3. It was lots of fun, and our sporting knowledge was amazing!



## YEAR 5 NEWS

This week in RE, we learnt about Ghandi as part of our work on Hinduism. The children made links to his work and that of Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King. The children wrote fact files about his life and explained his legacy.

In Maths, the children started learning about angles. We recapped some of the vocabulary linked to angles (right angles, acute, obtuse and reflex) as well as using a protractor to measure and draw angles.

In English, we have continued to read "Clockwork" and have used it to inspire us to write formal letters and character descriptions.

On Friday, the children enjoyed their cricket session delivered by "ProCoach".



## YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we calculated angles in regular polygons. We explored circles and learnt about the radius and the diameter and drew accurate circles with a compass. We were challenged to draw an accurately measured train, it included: regular polygons and circles.

In English, we identified the purpose of an orientation in a newspaper report. We discussed how they include the 5W's and summarise the newspaper story. We started writing our own orientation for our report about the Three Little Pigs.

For the past couple of weeks in RE, we have learnt about the Islamic faith. We Looked in detail at the 5 "Pillars of Islam" and Mosques. We created powerpoints all that we had learned and gave reasons why some Pillar might be more important than others.
