#### **COLLECTIVE WORSHIP**

On Monday, we listened to Sunday's Gospel which was about the calling of the disciples- Simon, Andrew, James and John. In the passage, Jesus told them, "I will teach you to catch people." We thought about what this meant and how through our actions we too can "catch people".

This week, we have continued to think about the virtue of faith. This week, the children heard the story of when the disciples struggled to catch any fish but when Jesus suggested that they try putting their nets in a different place, the disciples listened because they had faith in him. Their faith was rewarded as they caught lots of fish.



In Tuesday's Collective Worship, we thought about the importance of listening and heard the story of when God called Samuel. Just like he knew Samuel, God knows your name, and God still calls young and old today saying, "Come, follow me." Listening to God and doing what he commands us to do isn't always easy. God might want you to stand up to someone who is doing something wrong, or to be a friend to someone who is lonely. God promises to be with us, especially in the midst of the most difficult things we could ever do.



#### **CLASS PAGES**

#### YEAR R NEWS

What a space adventure we have had again this week as well as being super busy working like a scientist. We have been testing materials if they are magnetic. We have been busy looking at the stars and creating them in many different ways. We have created stars using sticks and bands (using those fingers to twist), we have learnt about the constellations and even created them ourselves! We have also been on a space adventure and saw lots of galaxies using the Hubble Satellite imagesthe children were amazed at how a lot of stars could be beautiful. We then chose our favourite image and created a print of them - it was messy, fun and colourful!

In English, we have read, 'How to Catch a Star' and then wrote our own instructions of how we could do it ourselves. Lots of children wanted to put it in a bag, use a net and even get a giraffe or dinosaur to help!

In Maths, we have continued to look at composition of up to 5 (4+1=5, 3+1=4, 2+2=4 etc) as well as subitising - please counting to practise at home.

Thank you again for all your support! Please encourage your child to write in their sound book and read the words.

#### YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in English, we have been doing different spelling and grammar activities linked to our book. We have practised writing days of the week and have played different games to help us with this; we have looked at different ways we can spell the long 'a' sound and we have thought about different adjectives we can use.

Our focus in Maths has continued to be numbers to 20. The children have looked at different ways the number 20 can be represented, they have used number lines and have used the language 1 more and 1 less.

In Science this week, we looked at the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees. We also looked at what happens to an apple tree during the different seasons.

In RE this week, we have started to look at Baptism. The children have learnt that through baptism, people become members of the Church. Next week, we shall be visiting Church to look at the font and for Father Nicholas to tell us about what happens during a Baptism service. If any of the children would like to bring in photos or items from their baptism, it would be wonderful to see them.

#### YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we have been planning our own Orion stories. We chose one of the characters' fears and then thought carefully about how he could overcome this fear. We then prepared our own word bank, which included conjunctions and a list of adjectives which may be useful when writing our stories. We then used some of the adjectives to practise writing expanded noun phrases.

In Maths, we have worked extremely hard to practise drawing 2D shapes on squared paper. We had to count the squares carefully and keep our rulers steady to help us. We also looked at vertical and horizontal lines of symmetry and practised completing shapes so that they are symmetrical.

As part of our RE work, we listened to the story of The Ten Lepers. We thought carefully and decided that it was both a good news and bad news story. It was good news that the ten men were healed, but bad news because only one of them said thank you. We reflected on how Jesus may have felt about this and wondered about why the men forgot to say thank you. We learnt that even when we are so excited about something, it is still important to say thank you!

In Geography, we enjoyed looking at a coastline map and learnt how to use a key. We used the key carefully to work out the meaning of each symbol. We then used maps of Otley to compare symbols and to locate our school.



#### YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we wrote our setting descriptions about Pompeii, including fronted adverbials, adjectives and powerful verbs. The children then peer-assessed each others' work looking for different grammatical features.

In Maths, we looked at the 8 times-table and practised using factors to calculate multiples and divide them. We looked at the links between the 2, 4 and 8 times-tables and how we can use one to answer the others.

In RE, we read about the story of Jesus' Baptism and thought about the significance of John the Baptist and his life. The children discussed the events of John's life and decided which were more or less important to Catholics, then created art to represent the Trinity at the Baptism.

In Geography, we looked at how the tectonic plates of the Earth's crust push against each other and create different physical features like mountains and canyons.

In Science, we learnt about frictional forces. We carried out an experiment to find out which surface would provide the most friction to a rolling toy car. We tested bubble wrap, sandpaper, a towel and many more! We learnt about how helpful friction can be sometimes but also how dangerous it is if it provides too much heat.

#### YEAR 4 NEWS

In English this week, Year 4 have written some fantastic character and setting descriptions. They have thought carefully about the vocabulary to use to ensure they are creating a vivid image in the reader's mind. It has been great to see a variety of figurative language used in the children's work too.

In Maths, we have been working on mastering the formal written methods for multiplying 2- and 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number. The short multiplication method was introduced for the first time, and they answered calculations in both the expanded form and then in the formal short single-line form.

In Geography, we worked in pairs and used Google Earth to view an aerial perspective of the River Wharfe. The children located its source, traced its journey and identified different human and physical features along its journey.

In PE, we continued with our skipping practice in preparation for the skipping festival next term. We had lots of volunteers in class this week demonstrating how their skipping had improved. Well done, Year 4!

#### YEAR 5 NEWS

In English, we have started looking at a new book that will be the focus of our lessons for the next coming weeks. The children made some fantastic predictions on what they think the book will be about from looking at the front cover. They included a variety of different conjunctions and modal verbs to show possibility within their predictions. After revealing the summary of the book to the children, they then went on to generate various questions they have relating to the book using a method called 'talk to the hand'.

In PE, the children enjoyed their second week of learning about inclusive world sports. They had the opportunity to play 'New age Curling' and 'Boccia'. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning different skills and adaptations used so that everyone can take part in and enjoy.

In Science, we carried out a small investigation to see how changing the position of a pivot can affect the amount of force required to lift the weight. The children recognised that the closer the pivot gets to the object that is needing to be moved needs less force that when it is moved further away.

#### YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been focusing on finding the wholes when we are looking at fractions of amounts - this can be quite tricky, but we've really worked hard at being able to answer them. Additionally, we've worked on developing our arithmetic skills of the four operations - we've already improved from last week!

In English, we have worked on writing our orientation for our newspaper report about the Three Little Pigs. Before we started writing, we thought about the five Ws (who, where, when, what and why). As a class, we came up with a great piece of shared writing - with some fantastic vocabulary - and then had a go at writing our own.

In Science, we started looking at the circulatory system and the functions of the heart, lung and vessels. We know the veins carry deoxygenated blood from the body to the heart and then lungs and arteries carry oxygenated blood from the lungs to the heart and then onto the rest of the body.


