








## **CLASS PAGES**

## YEAR R NEWS

This week in RE, we have been learning about the story of Jesus curing the paralysed man. We did some brilliant acting out of the story taking on different roles. As part of this we thought about people around us who are poorly and who makes us feel better when we are ill.





In Maths, we have explored adding two groups together in different ways. The children enjoyed the number bus activity where children were on the bus and then more children got on. They counted how many children were on the bus altogether.

We have enjoyed Art this week. We learnt about Jackson Pollock and how he poured, dripped and splashed paint onto his canvases. We then got the opportunity to make our own Jackson Pollock inspired art work.

## YEAR 1 NEWS

We began a new unit in Maths this week- capacity, which is the amount something can hold. We can use capacity to describe when something is full, half full and empty. We enjoyed a practical based lesson by filling different sized containers with water and discussing their capacity.

In RE, we have been thinking about the feelings of Mary and Joseph at the presentation of Jesus in the temple. This feast is known as Candlemas. When Simeon called Jesus a 'light', this was the inspiration for the celebration of Candlemas (February 2nd). It was and still remains to this day a Christian celebration of the purification of Mother Mary and the first appearance of Jesus in the temple.

In English, we have started a new book called Meerkat Mail which is all about Sunny and his adventures in the Kalahari Desert. We will be writing diary entries about Sunny's activities and learning to spell the days of the week.

In PSHE, we have been learning how to name colours in French. We sang a song and practised moving around the classroom when a new colour was called out.

We have started a new unit in Art called Colour Creations. We have been using lots of different types of magazines to create a collage of colours. We thought about how many different shades of a particular colour we could see and compared and contrasted these.

## YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we have been planning our own Orion stories. We chose one of the characters fears and then thought carefully about how he could overcome this fear. We then prepared our own word bank, which included conjunctions and a list of adjectives which may be useful when writing our storie. We then used some of the adjectives to practise writing expanded noun phrases.

As part of our work on multiplication, we have been looking at equal groups and using these to created repeated addition calculations and then we learnt how to write this as a multiplication calculation for example 4 + 4 + 4 = 3 lots of 4 or  $3 \times 4$ .

In Science, we began our topic about 'Animals' which includes humans too! We have had a great discussion about what a healthy diet should contain. We learnt that there are 5 main food groups and that our diet should include lots of fruit and vegetables!

We continued with developing our clay pumpkin sculptures this week by painting them in bright colours. When they are completely dry we will be adding dots, just like Yayoi Kusama!

### YEAR 3 NEWS

In Maths, we have continued to work hard learning our times tables. We have looked carefully at the links between the 2s, 4s and 8s and how we can apply our knowledge of known multiplication facts to support us with trickier calculations.

In English, we are writing our own narratives based on our class text. We are working hard to include all of the grammar that we have been focusing on this half term including adverbials and figurative noun phrases.

In RE this week, we researched the life of John the Baptist, read about Jesus' baptism and explored what this revealed to us about Jesus.

In History, we finished our Stone Age to Iron Age topic. We learnt about Iron Age roundhouses and hillforts before comparing homes through the ages and considering which we would have preferred to live in and why.

In Art, we have been exploring the work of William Morris and what inspired some of his pieces. Taking inspiration from the pieces we looked at, the children created some of their own William Morris style designs



## YEAR 4 NEWS

In Maths this week, we have focussed on division. We have looked at dividing 2-digit and 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers, sometimes even with remainders. We have used place value counters and charts to help us with this as well as using different visual representations.

We have continued to read "Until I Met Dudley" in English. This week, we have had a go at improving an informal explanation and writing our own imaginary explanation as to how a light works. We have also looked at the different features of a formal and informal explanation.

This week, we started our new Geography topic which is Settlement. In our lesson, we talked about what a settlement is and talked about why settlers would have chosen different locations in the past. We then looked at what parts of different names mean and tried to find settlements with these in their name eg cester - Leicester.


In RE, we have looked at how the Last Supper links to the Mass and we have looked at the different artefacts found in Church. We talked about how they are used and why they are important.



YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths, the children have continued to work hard looking at adding fractions and mixed numbers. They have been able to identify when to find the common denominator in order to add two or more fractions together. Along side this, the children have been able to analyse and experiment with two different methods of working out when adding two mixed numbers together and offer an explanation for which method they prefer.

In English, we have produced some wonderful narrative poems! We had a range of different themed ones from mystery, nonsense and humorous. The children really enjoyed using different poetic devices within their poems and I have thoroughly enjoyed reading them. Well done Year 5!





## YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we looked at scale drawings and scale factors. We began looking at quadrilaterals that had been enlarged by a scale factor. After this, we drew the enlarged quadrilaterals and even had a go at right angle triangles. We can now identify scale factors from given lengths too. On Friday, we developed our knowledge about ratios and put them into problems.

In English, we looked at non-chronological reports based on marine life and giant African land snails. We identified features - text and linguistic - which will help us to write our own about an animal.

In RE, we discussed the similarities and difference between The Passover, The Last Supper and the Eucharist. We came up with so many! We know that a sacrifice is the common link between all of them. Our task was to create a piece of artwork which shows all three. Some pieces of art were amazing - look out for them on the website!

On Friday afternoon, we watched a live interview with a Holocaust survivor as part of Holocaust Memorial Day. We were so interested in the survivor's life and what they went through.


