
O Jesus, let your light from heaven shine down.

CLASS NEWS

YEAR R NEWS

This week in Reception, we said goodbye to our nine chicks. Farmer Liz came and collected them to take them back to her farm to grow up. She is going to send us updates as they get older. On Monday Mrs Hart brought Ginger the hen in to complete Reception learning about the life cycle of a chicken. Amelia said she liked "when it flapped its wings". Grace said she learnt that "the red things mean it's healthy" when talking about the comb and wattle.



We have continued learning about the Queen's Jubilee this week. We have enjoyed playing in our very own 'Buckingham Palace', designing crowns and painting Union Jack flags.

We have been reading the 'Queen's Hat'. We thought about what type of hat we would design for the queen. We drew our designs and wrote about them. Freddie wrote, "The queen's hat is stripey and yellow and it has feathers and flowers at the side".

In Maths, we have been learning about doubling. We know that when we double we have to add the same. This week we have been using butterfly's wings to match the spots to help us double. Ask your child if they can double different amounts to 5

Finally in PE, we have been exploring different ways of balancing. We practised balancing using different parts of our body.

YEAR 1 NEWS

Wow, what a jam-packed Jubilee themed week we have had in Y1! We started the week by making our Jubilee puddings: a zesty, lemony trifle and a rich, chocolate mousse tart with raspberries and meringues. The best bit was tasting our creations and they were delicious. We think the Queen would agree too!



In English, we have been editing and improving our writing about the Queen. We focused on varying our sentence starters, using interesting adjectives and conjunctions to add extra information to our sentences.

In Maths, we have been looking at addition through the part-whole model. This representation helps us to visualise how amounts can be combined to make a total. We used counters and a rekenreck to help us.

In ICT, inspired by the abstract paintings of Piet Mondrian, we have been using the paint program to experiment with the arrangement of different sized and coloured squares.

Our week ended with our wonderful, Platinum Jubilee Assembly. It was so special being able to sing and read aloud in front of our parents and carers. We hope you have a wonderful half term and enjoy your own Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

YEAR 2 NEWS

As part of our English work, we imagined that we were the cat of Thomas Farriner. We wrote diary entries from the viewpoint of the cat when the Great Fire broke out. We described the cat's feelings, the sights and sounds surrounding him. We had some wonderful ideas and used lots of expanded noun phrases.

In Maths, we continued out work on shape. We investigated 3D shapes, looking at the number of faces, edges and vertices. To help us with this, we made giant 3D shapes using dowel and plasticine. The dowel showed the edges and the plasticine showed the vertices.

We have worked hard in History and enjoyed the challenge of thinking about why the spread so quickly. We had to find evidence from 2 different pictures to back up our reasons. We then discussed what help was on offer to the people whose houses were burnt down. We found out that King Charles provided canvas for tents and set up fire posts to provide bread and beer!

As part of our Jubilee celebrations, we have enjoyed making crowns and Union Jack flags. We imagined what kind of crown the queen would enjoy wearing and made them bright and colourful.



YEAR 3 NEWS

This week in English, the children have been exploring alternative endings to our story - 'Jim - A Cautionary Tale' by Hilaire Belloc. We have been thinking about different 'sticky endings' for naughty Jim.

In Maths, we began learning about equivalent fractions. We learnt about the meaning and discussed the relationships between the denominator and numerator in different equivalent fractions.

In Music, the children are progressing well with the Ukulele and they can now play the Ukulele and sing at the same time with confidence!

In Science, we went on a search for flowering plants around the school grounds.

In Geography, Year 3 worked in groups to conduct a research project about different US states. They gathered their information before presenting them as eye-catching posters.



YEAR 4 NEWS

We have had Assessment Week this week in Year 4. The children have completed a variety of maths, reading and punctuation and grammar papers and really worked their hardest, so well done Year 4!

As well as assessments, we have also continued our topic on time by looking at years, months, weeks and days. It would really help the children to practise rhymes that remind us of how many days there are in each month, e.g. "30 days have September...". It will also support them with their 7 times table to calculate the days in a certain number of weeks.

In RE, we learned about St Paul's work as a missionary, and how much he contributed to the early Church.

In Science, we concluded our topic on habitats by creating leaflets about British wildlife - the water vole and the swift. The children researched facts about their chosen animal, and the negative impact humans can have on their habitats. Finally, they suggested ways humans can help our native populations.



On Friday, we enjoyed a day all about the Jubilee. We watched a fantastic assembly by Year 1, designed our own Jubilee flags, and finally had a lovely picnic and games afternoon on the field.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In English this week, we have continued reading Beowulf and have practised our skills in using adverbs, parenthesis and relative clauses. In our History topic, the children learnt about how Christianity came to Britain in Anglo-Saxon times and looked at ordering events chronologically.

On Tuesday morning, the children enjoyed playing games of football on the field as part of our PE work and we even had a chance to practise our penalties. In the afternoon on Tuesday, we were learning about asexual reproduction in plants and took some geranium cuttings to see if we could grow some new plants.

In RE, we learnt about our world faith - Hinduism - and Hindu beliefs about life after death. We then used our computer skills to create information posters about it. We hope all the children have a lovely half term and enjoy the Jubilee celebrations.



YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we collaboratively planned a Jubilee party. We had a budget of £1000 and had to cater for 70 people. We had to think about venue, food, entertainment, decorations and gifts whilst staying within budget. We had great fun designing our ideal parties - but one group decided to spend £600 on balloons and bunting alone!

In English, we watched an alternative, dark ending to the Three Little Pigs traditional tale. We became journalists and reported the harrowing tale of the wolf being boiled alive. We wrote newspaper reports showing off our journalistic skills.

In RE, we continued to develop our knowledge about Islam. We made links and compared similarities and differences between our faith and the Islamic faith.


