Hi everyone,

Thank you for a wonderful week in school: for your hard work and your ability to make us all smile!

I am very impressed with the wonderful artwork in Year 3 who have recreated some Stone Age wall paintings. The quality and creativity of the pieces of work are outstanding. The effort, care and skills used by the children is evident in their final piece of artwork. They are definitely pieces of work to be framed.

There has been some super writing throughout school: YR - I have had some lovely handwritten cards with lovely, neat handwriting; Y1 wrote letters to Sonny, the meerkat; Y2 were using noun phrases to describe the moon linked to their book; Y3 have written a detailed piece of factual writing on Stonehenge; Y4 have been writing limericks; Y5 were using a range of figurative language to write poems based on a waterfall then turn the poem into a descriptive passage; Y6 have been continuing with letters of complaints – well done all!

Around school, you'll find posters and tip cards packed with ideas on how to start your conversation. There is also information about how to support others, and where to go if you need support.



CLASS NEWS



YEAR R NEWS

In Literacy, we have been reading non-fiction books about Space. We discussed the key features of these books such as contents page, index and glossary. We learnt lots of interesting facts about Space and then had a go at writing our own.

In Maths, we have started our new topic 'Growing 6,7 and 8.' Our focus this week has been on the composition of the number 6. We used ten frames and double-sided counters to make the amount in different ways. Maisie said "I know that 3 add 3 makes 6." We then tried recording our addition sums using the appropriate symbols.

In PE, we enjoyed engaging in a special 'Space Dance' routine. The children were super at pretending to be shooting stars and astronauts floating in space.

This week, we have enjoyed taking part in the RSPB Big Bird Watch event. On Tuesday, we made bird feeders to encourage the birds into our outside area. We saw lots of blackbirds. Have a go this weekend and see what nature you can spot in your garden!



YEAR 1 NEWS

In RE, we learned about how God revealed his Son's identity to Anna and Simeon when baby Jesus was taken to the Temple to be dedicated to the Lord. The children used puppets to enact this story.

In English, we have been reading a new book called Meet The Meerkat which is all about Sunny and his adventures. Sunny has been writing letters and is hoping to visit Otley soon. We thought about all the fun things Sunny could do during his visit and have been writing a letter back to him in the Kalahari Desert.

In Topic, we have been learning about deserts. We learnt that a third of our planet is covered in desert! We also learnt that deserts can be hot or cold. We thought about some of the animals that have the desert as their habitat.

Y1 have worked hard in Maths this week, we have been using our number bonds to ten to help us with addition. We have been using ten frames and counters to help demonstrate how much easier addition can become when you split a number into two parts (also known as bridging to ten). Some have us have found this tricky but we've persevered all week. Please help your child to master this concept by practising their number bonds at home.



YEAR 2 NEWS

We have started a new Maths topic this week. We are now learning about multiplication and division. To start our topic, we have been thinking carefully about what makes equal and unequal groups. We then started to develop our understanding of what an array is. We talked about how rows go from side to side and columns run from top to bottom. We also found out that arrays are made of an equal amount.

In English, we have been thinking about the structure of the story 'Orion and the Dark'. We talked about how the story has a beginning, middle and end and the events at each point. We then worked in pairs to plot this on a

story ladder. After that, we discussed the other fears of Orion and thought about how we could make up our own stories about Orion. We then planned our own ideas on a story ladder.

As part of our RE work, we listened to the story of The Feeding of the Five Thousand. We thought about how the crowd must have felt and what they might have been thinking when Jesus shared the bread and fish. We also discussed the importance of the story and what we can learn from it. Joseph H said, "We can learn to help people who do not have enough food and to be kind to others."



YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, Year 3 received a letter from the tear thief asking for our help. We created persuasive posters to encourage children around school to only cry 'valuable' tears for her.

In Maths, we have been looking at short multiplication with and without an exchange. We used lots of practical apparatus whilst learning how to set out the written method. Keep practising times tables to help us apply them quickly to our maths!

In History, we learnt about Stonehenge. We researched information, creating a mini fact file.

In PE, we learnt about the key shapes of gymnastics and applied them to sequences. We then thought about different methods of travelling and added our favourites to our sequences.

In French, we have been focusing on developing our linguistic skills with the emphasis on trying to develop our speech and pronunciation. This half term's focus has been what we might or might not have, for example; "Non, Je n'ai pas de crayon" and "Oui, j'ai un stylo."



YEAR 4 NEWS

This week in English, we have written our own limericks based on the limerick recited by the parrot in Cinnamon. Here is an example by Amelia:

In Maths, we have been working on 3-digit and 2-digit division. We have been working on manipulating numbers in order to partition them effectively. We have also found how important times tables facts are in dividing large numbers, and recognising remainders!



In Science, we observed the results of our experiment testing different substances on eggshells. We then learned about different organs in the digestive system, and wrote 'The Journey of Food' about them.

Cinnamon was a lovely girl,

Her eyes shone in the sun like a pearl,

She could not talk,

But enjoyed a night walk,

And brushing her velvet curls.

In RE, we learned about the different readings during the Liturgy of the Word. The children reflected on why it is so important to listen to the Bible and reflect on its messages for us.

YEAR 5 NEWS

This week in Year 5, we have started looking at non-chronological reports. We have read several different information texts about the World's tallest summits. The children have identified the features of these texts, played grammar noughts and crosses, and made notes on the pieces which they have then used to write a paragraph.

In Maths, we have continued looking at multiplication and have been multiplying 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers. The children have found this quite tricky as there is a lot to remember but they have persevered and are beginning to become more confident using the written method.

In PE, the children enjoyed using the equipment and practised making different shapes whilst jumping from platforms. We also practised some of the skills needed for performing cartwheels.

In ICT, we used laptops and ipads to look at a pre-prepared database about different countries. The children thought of different questions they wanted to know and then used the database to find the answers.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been finding fractions of amount including find the whole. To help us, we represented these calculations as bar models – this made it so much easier to find the missing values.

In English, last week we wrote letters of complaint to Mr Beardsley about our poor technology in school. With these written letters, we edited, redrafted and typed them up. We found redrafting a little bit difficult but when we discussed it as a class and looked at examples, everyone managed to draft parts of their work.

During our Art lesson, we looked at the artist Käthe Kollwitz who was a German artist in the early twentieth-century. We discussed how her art showed expression. We had a go drawing a face and adding details of shadows to express mood.

In PE, we continued working on our Basketball skills which we demonstrated by playing games against each other. We have worked on our dribbling, attacking and defending skills in Basketball.


