CROSS COUNTRY


Good luck to all the children taking part in the cross country race tomorrow.

YEAR R NEWS

We have started some more formal learning in Reception this week. We have had our first phonics lessons and have focused on the sounds s, a, t and p. We have segmented and blended words and practiced writing too. Children's reading log ins will be coming home today in their book so please read with your child and encourage them to pronounce the sounds carefully.

We have also begun our Drawing Club which has been based on the story, 'The Colour Monster'. The children have enjoyed exploring the story by drawing their own monster, creating a house for him and thinking about a thief who stole an emotion. Please ask your children about their ideas as they were very imaginative. We also learnt the following words with actionstranguillity, enraged, sobbing, shimmering and discombobulated - please ask your children about them!

In RE, we have been learning about what things God created and that he created the world. We also went outside to look at the world he had made. We saw lots of wildlife and enjoyed listening to the birds singing.

At the end of the day, Freddie (the bear) is coming for his first sleepover to join in with any adventures at home you may have (e.g. tea party, story time, walk). Please take very good care of him and record in the book with your child what you have done with him. We look forward to seeing him back on Monday and hearing all about his adventures.

YEAR 1 NEWS

In English this week, we read an acrostic poem about Autumn. The children then used stickers to illustrate the poem. Yesterday, we then had a go at writing our own acrostic poem about harvest, ready for our class assembly next Friday.

We had a very exciting afternoon on Tuesday as not only did we plant different bulbs (daffodils, crocus, snowdrops and tulips) as part of our science work but we also got to meet our Year 5 reading buddies for the first time. The children loved choosing a book for their buddies to read to them in the library.

Having previously learnt about the 7 continents in Geography, our attention has now turned to the UK. The children listened to a song which told us the 4 countries of the UK and the capital cities. Here are links to the songs, if your child wants to listen to them at home.

YEAR 2 NEWS

In English, we have been imagining what the old lady in 'A Squash a Squeeze' would write in her diary. We started to plan our diary entries, carefully thinking about each event and linked it to our work about the feelings of the old lady.

In Maths, we have been working hard to place numbers on number-line. We had to used our knowledge of our multiples of 10. We looked carefully at the start number and end number to work out the intervals in between. We also started to use this knowledge to begin to predict where numbers would be on a number-line.

As part of our Science work about habitats, we enjoyed looking around the school grounds to find microhabitats. We found lots of different habitats such as under rocks and stones, rotten logs and on trees. We found lots of different minibeasts such as woodlice, spiders, worms and ladybirds.

In RE, we continued to learn about Abraham and thought about the promises God made and how Abraham showed trust in God even though it must have been a very difficult thing to do leaving his home behind.



YEAR 3 NEWS

In English this week, Year 3 have been publishing their diary entries. The standard of presentation and content is fantastic, and all the children should be very proud of themselves.

In Maths, we have continued exploring place value and numbers within 1000. The children used interactive place value charts to find more and less than a number within 1000 using place value counters and explored exchanging hundreds, tens and ones.

In History, we looked at the major achievements from the Palaeolithic to the Iron Age. The children thought about what continued into each age and what new innovations changed early humans' lives.

In Science, the children experimented with rock samples to work out whether they were sedimentary, metamorphic or igneous. They used sandpaper, water and vinegar to test different properties.

YEAR 4 NEWS

We've had a super week in Year 4. We started the week with a very exciting skipping festival coaching session. We've been enjoying practicing all our new skills out on the playground and can't wait to put all that practice to good use in our skipping festival in the Spring term.

We've been continuing our work about the Romans. This week we have been learning about Roman poetry and have been preparing to write our own next week. In Maths, we've learnt about Roman numerals and played some fun games using them.

In RE, we've consolidated our learning on diary writing from our English lessons by writing a diary entry from the point of view of an Israelite slave set free by Moses.

Thank you for joining us at our first class assembly on Friday. We loved supporting the charity Macmillan cancer support. We really enjoyed hosting a coffee afternoon for our grown ups too. Thank you to those who joined us and helped us raise money for a brilliant charity.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In English, we have started our new topic based on the book 'Hidden Figures'. This book focuses on four Afro-American, female mathematicians who faced many challenges during their journey working at NASA. The children have spent time summarising this non-fiction piece of text and answering a variety of retrieval, inference and vocabulary questions as well as using expanded noun phrases to describe a character in this book.

In Maths, we are coming to the end of our place value topic and have been focusing on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 10,000, and 100,000, using pictorial and abstract resources such as number lines and place value charts to support them. The children were able to label the numbers in order to see which number was closest as well as recognise that if a number is 5 or above you round up and if it's 4 or below you round down.

In Science, we have continued with our topic of Earth and Space, beginning to describe how and why our planets are spherical in shape, based on Aristotle's research and evidence. We also ordered the planets from closest to the Sun to furthest away.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have revisited addition and subtraction and answered a variety of problem-solving questions. Additionally, we looked at common factors and common multiples.

In English, we focused on chapter 2 and wrote a journal from the man's point of view. Before we started writing, we watched the video of the chapter and wrote down feelings that the man was experiencing when arriving at his new destination. We were then able to use these emotions in our writing to convey thoughts and feelings.

During our Science lesson, we looked at classification keys. We thought about questions that could identify different Liquorice Allsorts. We really enjoyed classifying these sweets and it helped us to understand how we can classify plants and animals.

In PE, we are continuing to enjoy our rugby topic. We have continued to develop our passing, attacking and defending skills in small group games. When playing, we realised that communication is key and must be used when playing in a team.




